Cards beat Culver 56-6

Jewell had no problems at all in overcoming the Culver Wildcats in Canton on Saturday.

The fast-improving Jewell defense swarmed over Culver, causing five turnovers, allowing 0 yards rushing and causing 6 turnovers. These were quickly turned into scores by Kelly Groom and company as he found

Mike McGill on strikes of 36, 38 and 25 yards while trotting into the end zone twice himself.

On the afternoon, Groom was 9 for 13, with 142 yards, three touchdowns in the air and two on the ground. McGill grabbed four of Groom's tosses for 131 yards and three scores.

As far as the Cardinal rushing

game was concerned, it again operated without the services of David Cunningham but his stand-in Steve, Hodges, accounted for 120 yards in 21 carries and Scoop Gillespie added 70 more to the Card's total. Vic Davolt, again showing excellent ability, picked up the first Cardinal score on a one-yard run.

Jewell, which substituted with abandon on the last half, picked up the last touchdown as freshman quarterback Andre Nelson found Marty Hensley for 45 yards and Jerry Burch's eighth extra point put the score at 56-6.

On the basis of its victories this season, Jewell now advances to the NAIA Division II playoffs.
