THE COACHES

Vic Wallace begins his first season at William Jewell this year following the resignation of Stan McGarvey who left to accept a position as assistant football coach at the University of Cincinnati. This will be Wallace's first head football coaching position on the college level. A 1965 graduate of Cornell College, Wallace was head football coach in high schools at the 1A, 2A and 4A levels. Vic spent three years, 1974-77, at Carroll College in Wisconsin as offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and head wrestling coach. In 1977-80, he assumed the same position at Morningside College in Iowa and last year coached the tight ends at Texas Tech University of the Southwest Conference. Vic will be offensive coordinator and coach the offensive line.

Vic and his wife, Dee, have moved to Liberty with their family of three children, Mike 12, Mark 10 and Amy 5.

Four veteran coaches at Jewell will return in 1981. Dan Griggs will serve as defensive coordinator, Jim Nelson, a former head football coach at Jewell will coach the defensive ends, Rodger LaBach will again coach the defensive interior and Darrel Courley will coach the quarterbacks and receivers.

Three new assistants will join the 1981 staff. Bert Cooper will coach the linebackers, Doug Carter will coach the offensive backs and T.J. Brown will assist in the offensive line.

PRE-SEASON OUTLOOK

Coming off a banner campaign in 1980 that saw the Red Rage roll to a 10-0-1 record and a trip to the NAIA Division II National Playoff Semifinals, the 1981 edition of William Jewell football figures to continue in their winning ways. With eight starters returning, both offense and defense talent should be aplenty on the gridiron in Liberty, Mo.

A quick look at the defense that ranked first in District 16 in scoring defense, 2nd in rushing defense, 3rd in total defense and broke a school and district interception record (35) in 1980, shows that Cardinal opponents will have to earn every inch of turf again in 1981. Leading the way should be a solid corps of linebackers that accounted for 41 solos, 354 assists, 26 QB sacks, and 12 turnovers last year. Seniors Gary Ainsworth (Boonville, Mo.) and junior Steve Mattingly (St. Louis) collectively have seven years of starting experience behind them. Ainsworth and McGill should be strong candidates for All-American honors. Giving serious contention for a starting berth will be sophomore Jan Redmond (KCMO) and transfer Timmy Johnson (KCMO).

Anchoring the defensive line will be junior Guy Weber (Hillshoro, Mo.). The Redbirds will feature abundant quickness in the interior line and Weber should be joined in the trenches by seniors Wayne Schmidt (Tonawanda, NY) Jim Tubbs (Portageville, Mo.) and junior Lonnie Brunns (St. Clair, Mo.). Transfer Phil Devan (Omaha, Nebraska) should add great depth in the defensive line.

The defensive end position will prove to be the pivotal position in the Cardinals defensive scheme. Junior Doug Henderson (NKC, Mo.), sophomores Jerry Twigg (Liberty, Mo.) and Troy Mitchell (Hannibal, Mo.) and a host of "linebacker types" will be vying for starting spots. Whoever emerges as top dog will have survived a fierce battle for the starting berths.

Opponents aerial attacks again will be prey for the Cardinal secondary. Starters returning to this unit are: junior Dave Armstrong (Woodriver, Ill.), sophomores John Fritz (Shwnee Mission, Ks.), Paul Taylor (St. Louis, Mo.) and Danny Christian (St. Louis, Mo.).

Offensively the Red Rage will get strong leadership from junior All-District quarterback Kelly Groom (LaGrange, Mo.). Although Kelly led the Cardinals to an undefeated season in 1980 he will have fierce competition from sophomore Andre Nelson (Webster Groves, Mo.) and transfer Greg Houlihan (Springfield, Mo.) and David Brock (Clinton, Mo.).

On the receiving end of the aeriels from the Cardinals quarterbacks will be a flock of fleet footed receivers, headed by potential All American enior Mike McGill (NKC, Mo.). Joining McGill should be senior Marty Hensly (Jefferson City, Mo.) Darrel Schwabe (KC, Mo.) and tight end Scott Martin (KCMO).

Trying to fill the shoes of graduated two-time All American David Cunningham at running back will be an interesting development to watch. Sophomores Fernandus Gillespie (St. Louis, Mo.) and Steve Hodges (St. Louis, Mo.) should have the inside track to team up with returning senior Vic Davolt. Transfer Wayne Landrum (KCKS) will give the Redbirds a big back with power to compliment the speedsters.
