NAIA PLAYOFF SYSTEM

The NAIA utilizes a playoff system to determine its teams and to settle the Divisions I and II national football championship.

From 1958-1977 the NAIA selected four teams for the playoffs, and, in 1978, expanded its playoff format to include eight teams in each division.

DIVISIONS AND AREAS

Unlike basketball, where NAIA institutions compete in districts, NAIA football-playing institutions are classified according to Division I or II. When the NAIA divided into two divisions in 1970 member schools were given the option of choosing their division of competition. The NAIA Football Coaches Association Review Board has the authority to rule on changes in a given division once a school is placed there. The Review Board rules on divisional changes in January of even-numbered years.

Within each division member institutions are arranged according to geographical areas (see previews of divisions for breakdown on teams in each area, beginning on page 8).

THE RATERS

Teams selected for participation in the playoffs are determined by weekly ratings throughout the season. Selected members of the NAIA Football Coaches Association (16 raters in each division, four per each geographical area) submit a weekly rating during a specified rating period to determine which teams will participate in the post-season playoffs.

In 1980 the **Division II rating period** will run from **Wednesday, September 16 to Sunday, November 15**. The **Division I rating period** will run from **Wednesday, September 16 to Sunday, November 22**.

SELECTION OF TEAMS

- Teams must declare their intent to participate in the NAIA championship football program by **September 15**.
- Teams must be ranked in the top 12 in the last regular-season weekly rating — November 15 for Division II, November 22 for Division I — to be considered for the playoffs.
- The top-ranked team from each of the four geographical areas (in each division within the top 12) are automatically selected for the playoffs.
- The next four highest-ranked teams, regardless of geographic area, and not already selected, complete the eight-team field.
- No more than two teams from the same conference (within the same division) may be selected for the playoffs.
- Teams with four or more non-winning games will not be selected to participate in the playoffs.
- Teams may be paired according to geographic proximity to each other for the quarterfinal rounds. Members of the same conference will play each other no later than the semifinal round.

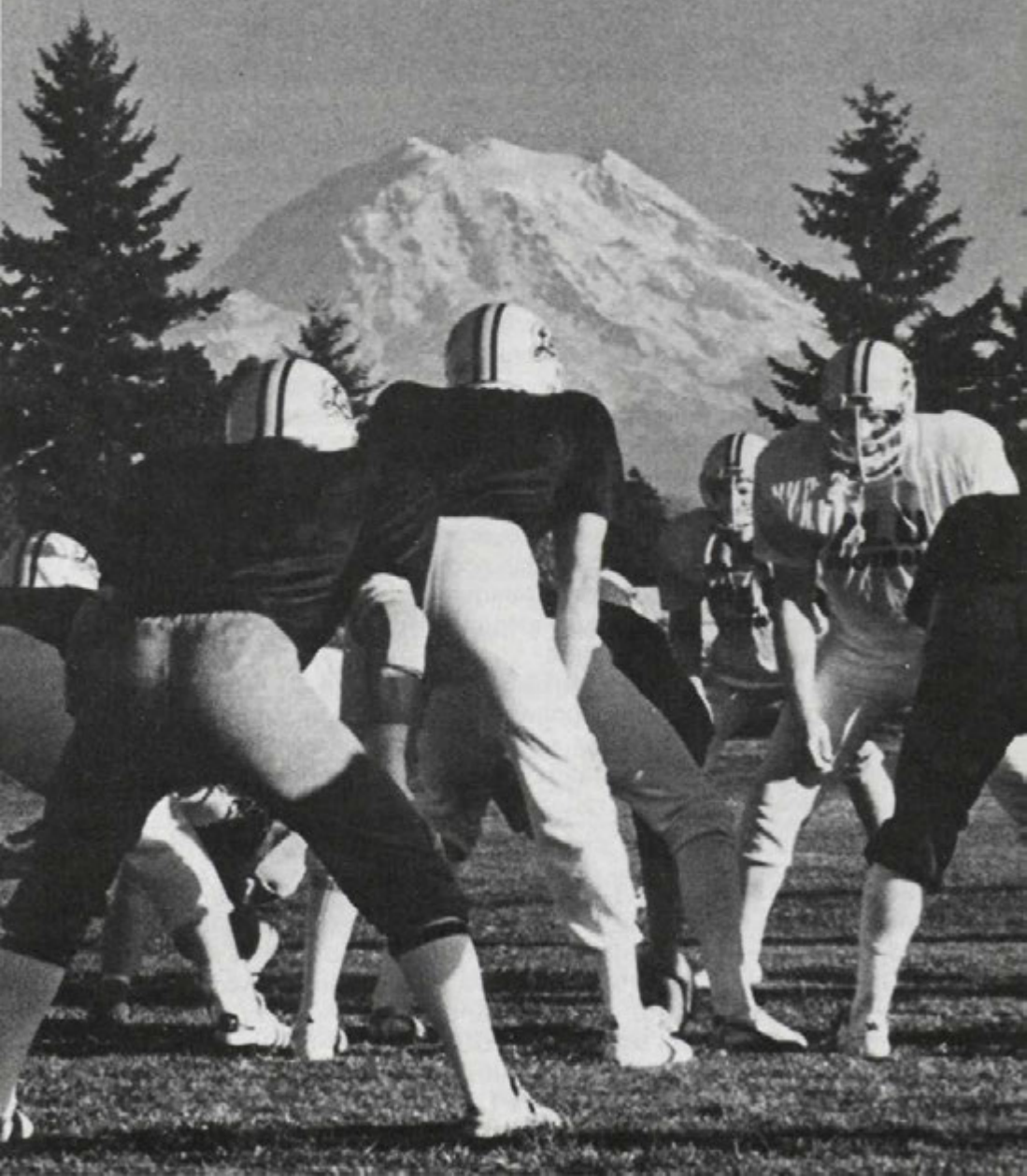

The coaching staff at **KEARNEY STATE NE (9-2-1)** is "singing the blues" once again about the loss of 31 lettermen and how the Antelopes could be in for a long, long season with the rest of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference vastly improved. Nevertheless, the rest of the CSIC coaches have heard that tune before and you couldn't get any one of them to diverge from Kearney as the "team-to-beat" in 1981.

The Lopers will be after a third straight appearance in the national playoffs and their fourth in the last five seasons. Kearney has either won or shared a piece of the CSIC championship every season since the league formed in 1976. Among top returning players for 10-year head coach Claire Boroff are All-America defensive tackle Jeff Stenslokken (6-5, 225, sr), all-league center Jerry Scott (6-3, 235, sr) and standout linebacker John Herz (6-2, 210, sr). The Lopers will be inexperienced on offense, especially at quarterback and running back.

Beyond Kearney State, the CSIC has some very talented teams lined up in 1981, but this league has become famous under the "any given Saturday" saga. The balance and numerous amount of upsets week-in-week-out has made it a great football conference.

Last year's runner-up **PITTSBURG STATE KS (7-4-0)** returns 13 starters and will be good again, but the Gorillas can't possibly be vastly improved considering the loss of All-America running back Richard Overton, all-league defensive tackle Jim Matthews and quality kicker Kevin Shipley. Defense will be the strongest area with the return of linebacker Mark Kilgore (6-2, 210, jr), middle guard Ron Freeman (6-2, 220, sr) and free safety Willie Fritz (6-1, 185, sr).

MISSOURI WESTERN (5-3-2) will have 39 lettermen including 17 starters returning and the Griffons will be one of the most explosive offensive teams around. Leading the returning veterans for Coach Rob Hicklin will be quarterback Greg Feters (6-2, 175, jr), two-time honorable mention All-America receiver Tim Hoskins (5-9, 172, sr) and career rushing leader Rodney Stephenson (6-2, 202, sr). **MISSOURI SOUTHERN (6-3-1)** on the other hand will be especially tough on defense where Jim Frazier's Lions feature defensive linemen Kelly Saxton (6-3, 245, sr) and Tom Fisher (6-2, 255, sr).

Both **WAYNE STATE NE (4-5-0)** and **FORT HAYS STATE KS (4-4-2)** will field teams capable of contending for the CSIC title also. Wayne State expects to have 18 starters back for Coach Del Stolltenburg including multi-versatile receiver and kick-returner Pat Maxwell (5-11, 190, sr). Ft. Hays had a decent season a year ago despite a very young ball club, so the Tigers are expected to be much improved with 33 lettermen coming back. Top returnees include tight end Phil Brethower (6-5, 220, sr), offensive tackle Mike Norris (6-2, 230, sr) and linebacker Doug Doubek (5-11, 185, jr).

Additionally, both **EMPORIA STATE KS (2-8-0)** and **WASHBURN KS (2-8-0)** could be better teams by the time the conference schedule rolls around. Emporia should be improved on defense where Coach Bob Seamon has six returning starters including linebacker Bart Kuhlman (6-1, 200, sr). Washburn lost its nationally-ranked passing combination of Mike Atkins to Ron Hamilton, but the Ichabods under new head coach Glenn Jagodzinske might do better with a more conservative style of play anyway.

Over in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, a tight four-team race is anticipated. Richard Ulrich will guide **ADAMS STATE CO (8-3-0)** as Jim Paronto takes a year's leave of absence and he will have a team made up of 16 returning starters. The Indians will count on running back Sam Armijo (5-9, 175, jr) to spark the offense and all-league linebacker Phil DeLorenzo (5-11, 215, sr) is a proven star on defense. Punter Tommy Andreasen will also take over the placement chores as All-America kicker Rock Paulson has graduated.

SOUTHERN COLORADO (9-1-0) tied with Adams State for the RMAC title last year and just missed an NAIA post-season playoff berth, finishing ninth in the final rankings. Coach Mike Freidman's Indians will be minus three-time 1000-yard rusher Bill Gower, but will have 13 other starters returning including standout defensive performers Dale Cepfers (6-0, 185, sr) at linebacker and Rich Perea (6-1, 220, jr) at defensive end.

SOUTHERN UTAH STATE (6-3-0) is very excited about its prospects for a RMAC championship. Jack Bishop's Thunderbirds will include 33 lettermen, 17 back at their starting positions led by defensive tackles Dale Sampson (6-3, 241, sr) and Larry Harper (6-7, 271, sr), defensive back Dave Faddis (6-1, 192, sr) and running back Curtis Page (5-9, 205, sr). Quarterback is the big question mark for the T-Birds where Dave Mollica, ranked number two nationally in total offense last year, has graduated.

Until last season, **WESTERN STATE CO (6-4-0)** had won seven consecutive RMAC football championships. While the Mountaineers still have some rebuilding to do, you can bet Coach Bill Noxon's team will be in the thick of the league race. A total of 14 starters return, including 10 on defense. Leading the Mountaineer vets are running back Ron Linsacum (5-9, 183, sr), quarterback David Howell (6-2, 165, jr) and defensive back George Mau (6-2, 185, sr).

MESA CO (3-6-0) appears to much-improved with the addition of some solid junior college players and other transfers to go with 31 lettermen. The Mavericks top performer is all-district guard Kevin Dooley (6-3, 220, jr).

Out in the Evergreen Conference of the Pacific Northwest, there was a three-way tie for first last season between **WESTERN OREGON (6-3-0)**, **OREGON**

TECH (7-2-0) and **EASTERN OREGON (8-1-0)** and that trio is expected to battle it out for bragging rights in 1981.

Bill McArthur's Western Oregon teams had won five solo Evergreen grid titles until the three-way logjam a year ago. The Wolves will feature an outstanding defensive unit in 1981 with 10 returning starters including noseguard Hubert Phillips (6-1, 215, jr) and cornerback Dan Baldwin (6-0, 180, sr), but the offense is in for a facelift, especially at the skill positions.

At Oregon Tech, Coach Dick Arbuckle's Owls have post-season play on their minds with a good mixture of veteran talent and an impressive list of newcomers. Among the top returnees are offensive tackle Mike Farley (6-4, 256, sr), quarterback Randy Camat (6-2, 201, jr) and defensive tackle Jeff Willis (6-2, 246, sr).

Eastern Oregon was somewhat of a surprise last year, but the Mounties are obvious contenders in 1981 if they can come up with a good offensive leader at the quarterback position. Defense will be a strength, especially at linebacker and in the backfield where All-America safety Havan Jones (6-3, 185, sr), who led the nation in interceptions with 13, returns for Coach Don Turner. Rick Ward (6-2, 200, soph) gives the Mounties a quality kicking game. EOC has both Oregon College and Oregon Tech at home on this season's football schedule.

Elsewhere in the Evergreen loop, **SOUTHERN OREGON (3-7-0)** expects to get in the race as the Raiders return 15 starters including versatile safety/receiver Jerry Wolfram (5-9, 165, jr). **CENTRAL WASHINGTON (2-7-0)** still appears a few players short of contending although running back C.D. Hoiness (5-8, 170, sr) and linebacker Tim Kofstad (6-2, 195, sr) are talented veterans. **WESTERN WASHINGTON (2-8-0)** must count on many newcomers to step in for 10 departed regulars and to make matters worse, the Vikings will play five teams this season which were ranked nationally in 1980.

Over in the Northern Intercollegiate Conference, **MINNESOTA-DULUTH (10-0-0)**, **MINNESOTA-MORRIS (9-2-1)** and **MOORHEAD STATE (8-2-0)** finished one-two-three in 1980 and should be the three leading contenders again this season despite the loss of some key talent at each location.

Duluth must replace half of its starters from last year's undefeated squad that is still in disbelief that they didn't earn a post-season playoff spot. Jim Malosky's Bulldogs will be strongest on defense once again where they ranked sixth in the nation in scoring defense. Tackle Brad Jensen (6-5, 260, sr) and fullback Tom Stoll pace the returnees.

Morris also lost a load of senior talent but the Cougars are sure to regroup with incoming talent. Among the top individual veterans who will be back are wide receiver Tim Erickson (6-0, 170, sr) and defensive back Greg Windschill (6-1, 195, sr).

Moorhead State lost 10 starters to graduation, but the Dragons prided themselves on their depth in 1980 and 53 lettermen are expected back to fill in the gaps. Top returnees for Coach Ross Fortier will be linebacker Paul Brigandi (6-1, 218, sr) and safety Al Strandbert (6-3, 205, sr) off the famed flex defense of the Dragons which ranked sixth nationally in the NAIA a year ago. On offense, a replacement for record-setting quarterback Mark Reed is a major concern.

Both **ST. CLOUD STATE (6-4-0)** and **SOUTHWEST STATE (3-6-1)** are capable of jumping into the thick of the NIC battle if things get really competitive at the top. St. Cloud has 14 starters returning led by quarterback Tom Nelson (6-0, 180, soph), who had a fine freshman campaign, and defensive back Randy Schulz (6-0, 170, jr). Southwest State returns 36 lettermen including 16 starters, foremost of which is quarterback sensation Curt Strasheim (5-11, 185, sr).

Both **NORTHERN STATE SD (2-7-1)** and **BEMIDJI STATE MN (1-9-0)** should be improved football teams, but not to the extent that they will make a run at an NIC title. **MANKATO STATE (3-7-0)** has left the NIC for the North Central Conference and the Mavericks should be a team to be reckoned with as 14 Maverick starters return from a year ago.

Among the independent schools in Area I, **SIMON FRASER CAN (5-4-0)** will be stronger with 32 lettermen slated to return including leading rusher Dave Amer (6-4, 218, sr). **EVANGEL MO (1-10-0)** is still looking to break through and become a small college power, but Denny Duron's Crusaders are still a couple of seasons and quite a few players away.

In an area so long dominated by Texas schools out of the Lone Star Conference, 1980 marked a refreshing change as far as the rest of Division I was concerned and it will also be remembered as the year that the Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference took its place as one of the top small college football conferences in the country.

Leading a trio of teams who tied for the OIC title a year ago was **NORTHEASTERN STATE (11-2-0)**, which advanced all the way to the Division I championship final before falling a touchdown short of Elon NC, 17-10. Coach George Elliott's Redmen were criticized at times during the season for not playing a "great" schedule or rolling up any impressive scores, but the Tahlequah, Oklahoma school silenced that talk with its strong post-season performance.

The Redmen return 16 starters and a total of 27 lettermen in 1981 and should be a strong pre-season favorite to capture another OIC title. The return

of OIC player-of-the-year Lynn Pattillo (6-0, 175, sr) at quarterback should help the offense overcome the loss of a couple of other skill people including All-America tight end Jerry Wichert. The defense should be even better than last year with only two starting slots to fill and such outstanding personnel as defensive end Ervin McDonald (6-2, 210, sr), noseguard John Higginbotham (6-3, 265, sr), linebacker Ronnie Adkins (5-11, 205, jr) and defensive back Ron Scott (5-10, 175, jr). The top newcomer is running back Anthony Flanders (5-9, 165, sr) who transfers from Baker KS where he rushed for 1511 yards and 17 touchdowns for last year's top offensive team in the NAIA.

Northeastern shared the 1980 conference title with **EAST CENTRAL (7-3-0)** and **SOUTHWESTERN STATE (7-4-0)** and those two schools should be strong contenders again. East Central Coach Pat O'Neal is confident he has a good defense lined up in 1981 led by two-time all-district end Paul McGrady (6-3, 220, sr). On offense, the Tigers will feature running back Steve Pollard (5-8, 175, jr) and sophomore quarterback sensation Juan Johnson (6-0, 175, soph), but need to plug some gaps in the offensive line. Despite losing 13 starters, Coach Bob Mazie's Southwestern Bulldogs should stay in the title chase with performers like All-America cornerback David Thompkins (5-11, 172, sr) and quarterback Steve Price (6-2, 195, soph). A flock of junior college transfers are expected to give the Bulldogs immediate help.

Elsewhere in the OIC, **SOUTHEASTERN STATE (3-7-0)** has a capable offense but some question marks on defense and a noticeable lack of depth. **NORTHWESTERN STATE (1-9-0)** will have 30 returning lettermen but only seven of those players saw any extensive duty a year ago. Noseguard Brian Sochia (6-3, 240, jr) is a Ranger standout.

Among the independent teams in Oklahoma, **CAMERON (8-3-0)** will have 15 starters back from a fine 1980 squad. Cecil Morris has taken over the coaching duties and will direct an especially good offensive unit led by sophomore backs Emerson Brown (6-1, 205) and Bryce Vann (5-6, 185). **CENTRAL STATE (5-4-0)** is rebuilding after finishing as the national runner-up in 1979. The Bronchos will have a good defense led by all-district end Ken Oleson (6-3, 218, sr) but their offensive backfield of quarterback Scott Burger, tailback Steve Tate and All-America fullback Clifford Chatman is gone. **LANGSTON (1-8)** has some real problem areas and only six lettermen returning to help solve them.

Down in the Lone Star Conference, despite the fact a string of eight consecutive national championships was broken, everybody in the country still respects the grid tradition of the league. As many as three or four NAIA declarations from the LSC could throw a shock wave into the rest of Division I.

SOUTHWEST TEXAS STATE (8-3-0) will have 33 lettermen including 15 returning starters to attempt a repeat performance as LSC champions. The Bobcats under Coach Jim Wacker have the league's best quarterback, Mike Miller (6-2, 192, sr), who operates an offense which ranked third overall in the NAIA in 1980. On defense, cornerback Bobby Watkins (5-11, 191, sr) is the mainstay and University of Houston transfer Dan Essa (6-2, 245, sr) is expected to bolster the interior line.

Both **ANGELO STATE (8-2-1)** and **EAST TEXAS STATE (8-3-1)** were NAIA playoff teams last season and have enough veteran talent returning to be

outstanding teams once again. Jim Hess has 29 lettermen coming back at Angelo State and the Rams usually depend upon a solid defense to get them as far as possible. Although the Rams will need to replace seven defensive regulars, they will have the benefit of building around All-America linebacker Clayton Weishuhn (6-2, 220, sr), the most valuable defensive performer in the Lone Star last year. East Texas will miss the ability of All-America quarterback Wade Wilson, who has graduated, but the Lions will be a very good running team in 1981 with the return of all-conference tailback Cary Noeil (5-11, 200, sr). On defense, East Texas has a good interior front where end David Lowe (6-3, 215, jr) leads the way.

Elsewhere in the Lone Star Conference, **TEXAS A&I (7-4-0)** should be a real force after a quick rebuilding job following a national championship in 1979. The Javelinas main asset is tremendous depth at most positions and superior starting talent such as defensive back Durwood Roquemore (6-1, 180, sr), all-conference linebacker Joe Barefield (5-11, 200, sr) and running back Marcus Bonner (5-8, 170, sr). Despite the loss of All-America tailback Paul Hood, **STEPHEN F. AUSTIN (4-6-0)** is more concerned about its offensive and defensive fronts than running back. The Lumberjacks boast a premier center in Myron Anderson (6-2, 220, sr). **SAM HOUSTON STATE (3-7-0)** may be the most improved squad in the LSC as the Bearkats return 16 starters and will spotlight a healthy Tony January (5-9, 170, jr) at running back as well as quarterback Binky Ford (6-0, 180, soph), back to run the veer offense. **ABILENE CHRISTIAN (2-8-0)** is still without very many seniors in the starting ranks although one underclassman, running back Willie Kerley (6-2, 190, soph), was voted the freshman-of-the-year in the league last season. **HOWARD PAYNE (1-8-1)** does not appear to be a first division team yet but the Yellowjackets have a solid linebacker in Robert Morrison (6-3, 260, sr).

Among the Texas independents, **BISHOP (5-5-0)** has a bright outlook as the Tigers welcome 18 regulars back. **TEXAS LUTHERAN (4-6-0)** has a new coach as Vernon Fewell takes over a Bulldog club with good ability in the skill positions. **PRAIRIE VIEW (2-8-0)** should be much-improved with 16 starters coming back including a strong defensive secondary.

Over in the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference, its hard to visualize anybody denying **CENTRAL ARKANSAS (9-1-0)** of a repeat title. Although the Bears have some gaps to fill on defense to be a totally dominant team, their offense is superb led by standout quarterback Randy Huffstickler (6-0, 185, sr), running back Vaughn Edwards (5-10, 170, sr) and All-America receiver Ronnie Mallett (6-0, 170, sr).

If there's a better quarterback than Huffstickler in the AIC, it probably is Jim Goodman (6-2, 215, sr) at **ARKANSAS TECH (6-4-0)**. The Wonder Boys will be a top contender in the AIC with 16 starters coming back. When Goodman isn't throwing, he can give the ball to all-conference tailback Greg Jefferson (5-9, 175, jr).

SOUTHERN ARKANSAS (6-5-0) finished second in the AIC last year with a 5-1 record but the Muleriders had their troubles outside the league. New Head Coach Jimmy "Red" Parker takes over a very talented defensive club led by noseguard Doug Carter (5-11, 201, jr), but the offense will need to be revamped to make a run at Central Arkansas.

The rest of the AIC will not be labeled "serious contenders" but this league has great tradition in producing some surprise teams. **HENDERSON STATE (5-6-0)** has to replace running back Donnie Willis but the Reddies will have some strong defensive performers like all-conference tackle Larry Day (6-0, 240, jr). **ARKANSAS-MONTICELLO (4-6-0)** will be improved with seven starters back on each side of the line and will strive for better consistency. **OUACHITA BAPTIST (2-8-0)** hopes 30 returning lettermen and an outstanding crop of newcomers makes for a much better season in 1981. Defensive linemen Calvin Thomas (5-11, 220, sr) and Charles Reynolds (6-3, 225, sr) are Tiger mainstays. **HARDING (3-8-0)** has a good quarterback in Kyle Blickenstaff (6-3, 205, soph) but must improve on defense in order to become a contending team.

ARKANSAS-PINE BLUFF (5-6-0) has great potential in 1981 with 17 starters returning led by 1000-yard rusher Cleo Collier (5-10, 165, sr) and a solid defensive line anchored by Michael McInnis (6-7, 250, soph). The Golden Lions play an independent schedule.

Over in New Mexico, **NEW MEXICO HIGHLANDS (4-6-0)** showed signs of becoming a serious contender in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference last year, and the Cowboys return 18 starters in 1981 including two-time all-conference running back Dino Jones (5-6, 170, sr), capable quarterback Pete Przborski (6-0, 180, sr) and defensive end Jay Lewis (6-3, 210, sr). **WESTERN NEW MEXICO (1-8-0)** has some transfer athletes which could improve the Mustang program overall, but a RMAC title is still far out of reach. Independent **EASTERN NEW MEXICO (2-7-1)** has some key personnel returning and Coach Dunny Goode's Hounds will score more points with veterans like fullback Jack Clifton (6-2, 230, sr) and receiver Paul Fenstermaker (6-1, 170, sr).

In the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, **CONCORD (11-1-0)** is still being tabbed as the team-to-beat, but the Mountain Lions had their offense, which ranked second nationally in 1980, nearly depleted by gradua-

tion and will be more hard-pressed to repeat as league champs. Concord lost to eventual national champ Elon NC, 17-14 in the quarterfinals of the Division I playoffs last year. Tailback Matt Bland (5-11, 170, jr) is the heart of the Lions' returners on offense. Defense will be the strong suit in 1981 where Coach Tony Colobro has nine starters coming back including all-league defensive backs Marco Dowell (6-0, 195, jr) and Frank Dent (5-9, 165, sr), leading tackler Tom Bay (5-9, 198, sr) at linebacker and defensive tackle John Canty (6-1, 240, sr).

SHEPHERD (7-3-1), much like Concord, will be especially strong defensively this season with 10-of-11 starters back on that unit. Leading the defensive charges for Coach Walter Barr's Rams will be noseguard Mark Brower (5-11, 210, soph), who had a dozen sacks in his freshman season. Leading tackler Gene Lugat (6-0, 205, jr) also returns to his linebacker position. Holes in the offensive line are of concern to Barr, but his backfield remains intact including top rushers Blair Rishell (6-1, 200, sr) and Greg Clarke (5-10, 175).

FAIRMONT STATE (6-3-1) will have a senior-laden team in 1981 with 17 starters returning and Coach Dave Ritchie believes his Falcons are a solid contender for post-season play. Fairmont will be especially potent on offense where veteran quarterback Luc Tousignant (6-4, 205, sr) returns along with outstanding receivers Lennie Marshall (6-1, 180, sr) and Mark Walso (5-10, 180, sr). Offensive tackle Chris Humphries (6-2, 255, sr) is All-America material. Defense should not take a back seat to anybody as the Falcons lost only two regulars off that unit. Linebacker Joe Wirth (5-10, 185, sr) is a super player in the middle.

WEST VIRGINIA STATE (6-4-0) will be in the thick of the WVIAC battle with a harmonious blend of size and speed. Coach Oree Banks is especially excited about the ability of his offensive backfield where quarterback Dan Bolar (5-11, 180, soph) will operate with backs Walter Holman (6-0, 210, sr) and Anthony Weaver (5-11, 190, sr). On the offensive front opening holes will be mammoth tackle Joe Black (6-9, 278, sr). Defensive end Milton Spradley (6-3, 220, sr) anchors a capable defensive unit for the Yellow Jackets.

SALEM (6-4-0) normally would be in trouble considering the loss of four defensive linemen and two linebackers, but Coach Larry Blackstone believes his offense is good enough to keep the Tigers in the league race this season. A pair of huge offensive tackles, Doug Penneypacker (6-6, 265, sr) and John Ciparik (6-3, 260, sr) will be providing protection for the WVIAC's premier running back Greg Thornton (5-9, 175, sr).

Among the rest of the pack in the WVIAC, **WEST VIRGINIA TECH (5-4-0)** should be improved with 18 seniors on the team including standout defensive ace Tom Neely (6-0, 210, sr). **WEST VIRGINIA WESLEYAN (3-7-0)** has a complete rebuilding task on offense but the Bobcat defense will be very experienced led by tackle J.K. Milliken (6-0, 230, sr). **WEST LIBERTY STATE (0-10-0)** is a team that can only be improved, but the Hilltoppers may be much better in '81 than anybody expects as quarterback Frank Zebrasky (6-0, 205, sr) leads 30 returning lettermen. The rebuilding program is making progress at **GLENNVILLE STATE (1-8-1)** where second-year Coach Frank Vincent has 14 returning starters including all-league linebacker Mark Shafer (6-2, 220, jr).

Over in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Conference, the 1981 season can not arrive soon enough for **HILLSDALE (7-3-0)**. The Chargers and Coach Dick Lowry have a very bright outlook with 36 lettermen and 17 starters back from last year's squad which finished 18th in the final top 20 rankings. Quarterback Pat Riepma (6-2, 195, jr) returns to the offense along with all-league tailback Jerry Cifor (5-8, 180, jr), guard Mike Broome (6-2, 240, sr) and receiver/return specialist Rod Lee (6-1, 180, sr). Ron Gladnick (6-4, 245, jr) bolsters a quality defensive unit.

Although Hillsdale looks like a solid favorite to repeat in the GLIAC, the rest of the league has improved. **NORTHWOOD INSTITUTE (6-2-1)** has never experienced a losing season in the 12 years that John Finn has coached the Northmen and 1981 should definitely keep that mark going. Despite losing 2nd team All-America running back Jayce Smith to graduation, the Northmen will be improved on offense partially due to an outstanding frontline which includes center Tom Keenan (6-2, 225, sr), guard Terry Bussenger (6-0, 215, jr) and tackle Mike Kolp (5-11, 225, jr). Defensively, the Northmen return five of the seven frontliners from a unit which ranked fifth nationally in both total defense and rushing defense. Noseguard Willie Falls (6-0, 225, sr), tackle Girza Worthy (6-2, 230, sr) and linebacker Jeff Hudson (6-1, 202, sr) were all-district performers a year ago.

GRAND VALLEY STATE (7-3-0) finished as the 17th ranked team nationally in 1980 and Coach Jim Harkema's Lakers figure to have another quality season. A replacement at quarterback for David Quinley is an offensive concern at this time, but the Lakers have some other strong areas including linebacker where Randy Damstra (6-2, 210, sr) and Paul Svabik (6-2, 202, sr) return.

FERRIS STATE (4-4-2) should be the most improved team in the GLIAC with 16 solid starters returning to their positions and a good group of recruits. Quarterback Bill Costner has exited, but running back Greg Washington (6-2, 192, jr) will offer plenty of ability out of the backfield. The Bulldog defense looks as if it could be one of the better in the league with performers like tackle Roger Armantrout (6-1, 210, jr) and linebacker Russ Penning (6-1, 205, jr).

SAGINAW VALLEY (5-6-0) should be a better club but the Cardinals may be a year away from seriously getting back into the GLIAC race. They have a premier player in All-America lineman Eugene Marve (6-3, 230, sr).

A tremendous race is expected in the Wisconsin State University Conference where it should be even more competitive than last season which resulted in a four-way tie for first place.

LACROSSE (8-2-0) has 37 lettermen slated to return although half of its starters from a year ago will be missing. Quarterback Jim Kildahl (6-3, 205, sr) will direct the offense for the Indians who will miss receiver Craig Chrest. Jon Ackerman (6-2, 190, soph) seems quite capable of replacing 2nd team All-America kicker Tim Murphy. Defensive tackle Steve Rappley (6-2, 240, sr) will anchor the line but the linebacking corps needs to be shored up.

RIVER FALLS (8-2-0) also has a load of lettermen scheduled to return but 11 starting spots have been vacated. Coach Mike Farley will need to come up with a good running back to fill the shoes of graduated all-league performer

Dale Mueller and two-time All-America offensive guard Gerard Sonsalla will also be missing. Quarterback Jim Abbs (5-11, 180, sr) will be the nucleus of the Falcons offensive ability and linebacker Scott Lueders (6-0, 195, sr) will be the defensive ace.

PLATTEVILLE (7-3-0) was somewhat of a surprise team in 1980, but the Pioneers have the respect of all the rest of the league members this time around. Coach George Chryst has 14 starters returning and will be much deeper at several positions this season. All-conference running back Chris McLimans (5-11, 190, jr) is the key to the Pioneer offense and middle guard Chuck Voltner (6-0, 215, sr) paces the defensive effort.

STOUT (6-4-0) was tied for second in total defense nationally last season, but the Blue Devils may get more rave reviews on offense this year than any place else. Nine starters return on that side of the line including starting backs Ron Theis (5-8, 180, sr) and Bob Johnson (6-0, 185, jr), but a wishbone quarterback must be found to replace four-year starter Ken Kartman. Defense will once again be strong but not quite as deep as a year ago.

STEVENS POINT (4-6-0) returns all 11 starters to an offensive unit that might be one of the most explosive in the nation, but defense was a weak spot for the Pointers in 1980 and appears to be a very vulnerable area once again. The offense is centered around a big and experienced offensive line, two capable running backs and the potent passing combination of quarterback Brion Demski (6-2, 195, sr) to wide receiver Chuck Braun (6-2, 185, sr).

EAU CLAIRE (3-8-0) could also be a contender if the Blugolds can improve their defense. Veteran Coach Link Walker's team led the WSUC in total offense in 1980, despite finishing seventh in the league and he has key performers like honorable mention All-America running back Roger Vann (6-1, 180, sr) and quarterback Kevin Boglig (5-10, 165, sr) returning.

OSHKOSH (4-6-0) is looking for more consistency and a starting quarterback in 1981 and **SUPERIOR (0-10-0)** needs more help than Coach Mertz Mortorelli would care to think about if the Yellowjackets are to get on the winning track in the WSUC.

Wisconsin independent **ST. NORBERT (3-6-0)** may be able to post a winning season if a new quarterback can be found. The Green Knight defense is led by standout linebacker Tim Van Alstine (6-1, 210, sr), son of Knight Coach Larry Van Alstine.

Over in the Pennsylvania College Conference, **CLARION STATE (9-2-0)** will be awfully tough to beat with 36 lettermen and 16 starters coming back led by tight end Gary McCauley (6-4, 220, sr) and defensive tackle Mike May (6-2, 210, jr). **EDINBORO STATE (6-2-1)** under Coach Denny Creehan is capable of challenging Clarion but have some serious gaps to fill on defense. **INDIANA (6-4-0)** will be much more experienced with 16 starters returning but must find a replacement for quarterback Bob McFarland to throw to three outstanding receivers including all-district flanker Stan Betters (6-1, 185, sr). Linebacker Terry Carroll (6-2, 215, sr) is the Indians' defensive ace.

Elsewhere in Area III, independent **CENTRAL STATE OH (4-6-1)** will be a much-improved team and the Marauders boast one of the country's top running backs in Larry Kelly (5-11, 210, sr), who rushed for more than 1300 yards and 14 touchdowns last season.

Just because a victory by **ELON NC (13-1-0)** in last year's NAIA Division I Championship Bowl broke an eight-year dominance of the national title by a Lone Star Conference team, it doesn't mean that the South Atlantic Conference (SAC-8) is going to start producing a string of national champions. However, there is as much talent in the SAC-8 in 1981 as anywhere in the country, so don't be surprised if there is a repeat performance.

Elon will have an extremely difficult time pulling off an instant replay despite the fact the Fighting Christians will number 35 lettermen returning and 15 starters back from the title team. The biggest test for national-coach-of-the-year Jerry Tolley is producing another contender without the services of All-America tailback Bobby Hedrick, who became the NAIA's all-time career rushing leader last season and the number two all-time rusher in collegiate history. Hedrick's backfield mate, Fred Jordan (5-11, 190, soph) is expected to inherit much of the ground work, while quarterback John Bangle (5-11, 175, jr) returns to operate the offense. While the offense may not quite be up to top standards, the Fighting Christian defense will be among the best in the country with standout performers like All-America noseguard Chris Worst (6-0, 220, sr), backfield ace Charles Womack (5-11, 175, sr) and linebackers Ernie Tootoo (6-0, 205, jr) and Stanley Tootoo (6-0, 205, sr).

MARS HILL NC (8-2-1) tied Elon for the SAC-8 title in 1980 before losing to Kearney State NE in the Division I quarterfinals in overtime. The Lions under Coach Charles "Hoot" Gibson will have a good nucleus to stay in contention, but must also replace a key running back in all-district performer Kenny Phillips. All-America linebacker John Gullledge has graduated leaving a void in the middle of the Lion defense, but seven other regulars return on that unit including all-league and all-district tackle Ricky Williamson (6-4, 230, jr). Mars Hill led the nation in scoring defense last season and ranked second in total defense.

CARSON-NEWMAN TN (5-5-0) had to forfeit a couple of games last season, but the Eagles were clearly one of the best teams in the league. Coach Ken Sparks should reap the benefits of 40 returning lettermen including 14 starters and make a serious run at a SAC-8 title. Talent abounds in the Eagles' offensive backfield where both Van Williams (6-1, 205, jr) and Boyce Green

(6-1, 190, soph) can rack up the yardage and all-conference quarterback Jay Andrews (5-10, 180, jr) is a heady player. Defensively, some holes need to be filled, but the frontline looks especially strong with the likes of end Jerome Taylor (6-4, 190, soph).

NEWBERRY SC (4-6-0) has the experience to be a legitimate title contender if Coach Reed Charpia's Redskins can avoid injuries. The 'Skins are not deep at any position, but their first string talent is high quality including flanker Gary Cali (5-11, 175, sr) and all-conference defensive tackle Stan Stanton (6-4, 225, sr).

Cally Gault's **PRESBYTERIAN SC (4-7-0)** Blue Hose had a disappointing campaign in 1980 after making the Division I playoffs the season before. Although 33 lettermen return this year, the Blue Hose lost a dozen starters to graduation and will be young at many positions. Quarterback Jimmy Spence will be sorely missed. Offensive guard Larry Owens (6-0, 215, sr) leads a good offensive line to build around.

Don't be surprised if **GARDNER-WEBB NC (3-7-0)** makes so much improvement that the Bulldogs become a factor in the league race. A total of 19 starters return for Coach Tom Moore who will have the league's top passing game led by quarterback Chip Stuart (6-2, 180, jr). Stuart has been the all-conference selection at his position in both his freshman and sophomore seasons and ranked fifth nationally in the passing department last season. The Bulldog defense is experienced led by all-district tackle Ralph Warthen (6-5, 268, sr) but the unit is not deep at any position.

Second-year Coach Henry Vansant will be out to improve **LENOIR-RHYNE NC (4-7-0)**, but the Bears are without a lot of seniors and still have some distance to go to be contenders. Among the quality returnees is top SAC-8 receiver Steve Fleming (6-2, 175, jr) and linebacker Ernie Brown (6-1, 190, jr), the top tackler in 1980.

CATAWBA NC (1-9-0) is trying to put a few more wins in the books, but Coach Steve Shaughnessy has a tough chore with only six seniors on the squad. The Indians hope transfer quarterback John Coatta (5-11, 185, jr) will spark a dismal offense.

South Carolina independent **WOFFORD SC (7-2-2)** will be one of the top teams in Area IV. Coach Buddy Sasser lost only four starters off a good team from a year ago and his Terriers are thinking post-season play in 1981. Among the veteran talent is standout running back Lenny Best (5-11, 185, sr), defensive lineman Kirk Breland (6-1, 250, sr) and honorable mention All-America defensive back Tony Painter (5-11, 170, jr).

In the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, **NORFOLK STATE VA (5-4-1)** should be a title contender with 37 lettermen and 18 returning starters. The Dick Price coached Spartans will be a highly capable offensive team led by running back Orlando Goodhope (5-11, 180, soph) darting through holes created by standout offensive lineman Don Herring (6-4, 255, sr). On defense, the Spartans are stingy and have an especially good backfield led by strong safety Reggie Smallwood (6-4, 185, sr).

WINSTON-SALEM NC (5-5-0) will miss pro draftee Arrington Jones in the offensive backfield as well as 10 other starters lost to graduation. If the Rams hope to get in the CIAA title chase, their defense must improve and help the efforts of linebacker Carlton Watson (6-2, 220, sr).

At **JOHNSON C. SMITH NC (5-6-0)**, the Golden Bulls would seem to have enough experience and talent to make a serious run for the conference crown. Coach Wylie Harris welcomes 33 lettermen and 15 of his 1980 starters back led by all-district wide receiver Nate McDowell (5-11, 175, jr), sturdy running back Mark Sanders (6-1, 225, jr) and honorable mention All-America offensive lineman Ray Ellis (6-2, 250, sr).

HAMPTON INSTITUTE VA (5-6-0) has an excellent offensive attack paced by running back duo Dennis Mahan (6-1, 187, jr) and Anthony Armstrong (5-11, 197, soph), but the Pirates have too many question marks on defense to be considered a top contender for CIAA supremacy.

FAYETTEVILLE STATE NC (4-5-1) looks for more consistency in 1981 as the Broncos try to shore up their defensive unit. Quarterback Joe Valentine (5-10, 170, soph) paces the offensive effort. **BOWIE STATE MD (2-8-1)** will have a hard time competing this season as the Bulldogs bring a truckload of newcomers aboard to replace 15 departed starters. All-America defensive back Victor Jackson will be especially missed.

Among the independents in Area IV, **GUILFORD NC (6-3-0)** has a bright outlook with a bundle of returning lettermen. The Quakers are led on offense by quarterback Keith Millner (6-1, 195, sr) and have a standout defensive back in Jon Hoots (5-11, 170, sr).

LIBERTY BAPTIST VA (6-3-0) competes in Division I as a full-fledged NAIA member for the first time and could make a quick impression. Talented quarterback Glenn Inverso has graduated, but the Flames have a good back in Greg Mosely (5-11, 180, sr) and a quality receiver with Chris Patterson (5-10, 170, sr) at split end. The offensive line is of immediate concern to Coach Tom Dowling. Linebacker John Sanders (6-1, 214, sr) heads up a defensive unit which is good but not deep.

SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA (8-2-0) was hit hard by graduation and must open the 1981 season with four consecutive road games. Coach Oscar Lofton's Fighting Lions have strength in the offensive backfield with the return of backs Mac Boatner (6-2, 225, sr) and Charles Thomas (6-0, 190, sr). Defensive end Glenn Ferrill (6-3, 240, sr) paces a defensive unit which lost five starters.

The outlook is somewhat bleak for **DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA (2-7-1)** as the Firebirds try and install a bundle of new talent. Coach Ted Vactor does have a standout on each side of the line with wide receiver Charles Chisley (6-1, 185, sr) and linebacker Willie Middleton (6-1, 195, sr), both super athletes.

Defending national champion **PACIFIC LUTHERAN WA (11-1-0)** will have its work cut out for itself if the Lutes hope to make another bid for a post-season playoff berth and a repeat title. Tenth-year coach Frosty Westering bade baccalaureate farewell to eleven starters, six on offense and five on defense, including two All-Americans.

But depth was a Lute trademark in 1980 and Westering is hoping last year's attribute will benefit this season's rebuilding task. For one thing, the list of veterans is an impressive one. All-District fullback Mike Westmiller (6-1, 200, sr) and halfback Chris Utt (6-0, 180, sr), who was the offensive player of the game in last year's national championship contest, will provide a strong running attack. Sophomore quarterback Kevin Skogen (6-3, 187) threw 10 touchdowns in a back-up role last year and will have a capable receiver in '81 with Eric Monson (6-1, 200, sr) returning. On defense, 2nd team All-America linebacker Scott McKay (6-1, 225, sr) anchors the unit which also features defensive tackle Greg Rohr (6-1, 235, sr) and standout safety Jay Halle (6-1, 180, sr).

Add three outstanding transfers to the picture, an impressive group of freshmen and the general aura of enthusiasm that the national title stirred up and it indicates that PLU should once again be a top national contender.

There exists, however, a little task known as surviving the Pacific Northwest Conference race which might take its biggest toll on the Lutes' chances in 1981. Both **LINFIELD OR (9-1-0)** and **LEWIS & CLARK OR (4-4-1)** appear to have quality teams lined up with their own thoughts of post-season competition.

Veteran Linfield coach Ad Rutschman, who guided his Wildcats to the playoffs last year only to lose to Pacific Lutheran in the quarterfinals, faces a similar task of replacing starters — 13 to be exact — but the traditionally strong 'Cats should be in the thick of the league race despite a bunch of new faces. Replacing All-America quarterback Alan Schmidlin will be a major concern and three other national honorees are also gone, but the list of returning players includes flanker Pete Weymiller (5-8, 160, sr), tailback Leonard Brooks (6-0, 188, jr), middle guard Gordon Pang (6-0, 220, jr) and defensive tackle Greg Englebreton (6-1, 230, sr).

At Lewis and Clark, Coach Fred Wilson has 28 lettermen including 14 starters returning and the Pioneers appear quite capable of jumping into contention for the conference crown. Top returnees include quarterback John Evans (6-0, 180, soph) who should be throwing alot to wide receiver Dan Jones (6-1, 195, sr), a three-sport letterman who was featured in a national sports publication in the off-season. On defense, linebacker Mike Moore (6-1, 195, sr) and cornerback Rick Ludeman (5-10, 175, jr) will solidify a very capable unit.

Elsewhere in the Pacific Northwest, **WILLAMETTE OR (3-4-1)** will have a strong passing attack with the return of quarterback Scott Chan (5-11, 180, sr) and wide receivers Don Slayton (5-10, 175, sr) and Mark Chang (5-11, 185, sr). **WHITWORTH WA (4-5-0)** is depending on newcomers, especially quarterback Mike Martin from Los Angeles, to help out immediately. The Pirates lost defensive tackle Dave Pomante, a first team All-America pick last season. **PACIFIC OR (0-9)** should be much-improved with 36 lettermen and 13 starters coming back but the Boxers are not in a position to contend for a league title yet at this stage.

Over in the Frontier Conference, it looks like a real battle for supremacy between defending champion **CARROLL (6-4-0)** and **MONTANA TECH (4-6-0)**. Coach Bob Petrino's Saints captured the Frontier title in 1980 despite talk that it would be a rebuilding year at Carroll. Now the veteran mentor has 14 starters coming back, eight of which made all-conference, including son Bob Petrino, Jr. (6-0, 170, jr) at quarterback. Montana Tech will have 36 lettermen and 17 starters returning to the Oredigger camp and Coach Paul Giesey says that his squad has playoffs on the 1981 agenda. Tailback Steve Housler (6-0, 220, sr), an outstanding runner, will lead the Orediggers on offense and linebacker Shawn Hertz (6-1, 215, sr) is a mainstay on defense.

WESTERN MONTANA (4-5-0) lost half its starters to graduation but the Bulldogs have five all-league selections coming back including linebacker Scott Bockman (6-2, 215, sr). **ROCKY MOUNTAIN MT (1-7-0)** will have a little more experience in 1981 but the Bears still appear to be one or two players short in the skill positions to legitimately get into the Frontier Conference race.

In the North Dakota Collegiate Athletic Conference (NDCAC), it could be a hotly contested three-team race between defending champ and national semi-finalist **VALLEY CITY STATE (8-1-0)**, perennial power **JAMESTOWN (4-3-0)** and **DICKINSON STATE (5-2-0)**.

Valley City had one of the nation's top defenses in 1980 and the Vikings should be even better on that side of the line this season with the return of All-America defensive back Jon Bolstad (5-11, 175, sr), linebacker Ivan Thorpe (6-0, 205, sr) and end Jeff Hooley (6-0, 200, sr). On offense, all-conference receiver Doug Black (5-11, 150, jr) returns but Coach Jim Dew must find a replacement for graduated quarterback Mark Smetana.

Coach Rollie Greeno's Jamestown Jimmies will be very strong once again as 14 starters are expected back to man their positions including giant All-America offensive tackle Ron Hausauer (6-2, 285, sr), all-conference running back Kyle Engelhardt (6-2, 220, sr) and linebacker Scott Pederson (6-1, 220, sr). Forty lettermen at Dickinson State should be enough to keep Hank Biesolt's Blue Hawks in the NDCAC race all the way. Quarterback Greg Becker

(6-0, 160, jr) will operate the offense and defensive backs Doug Sturlaugson (5-10, 175, sr) and Roger Rudolph (5-11, 170, sr) are the defensive leaders.

Both **MINOT STATE (2-4-0)** and **MAYVILLE STATE (4-3-0)** have 15 starters returning and could pull off a few surprises in the conference if taken too lightly. All-league running back Tom Addison (6-0, 195, sr) paces the Beavers' attack at Minot, while quarterback Paul LeClair (6-3, 200, soph), who had an outstanding freshman campaign, leads the Comets of Mayville State.

A great race is expected in the South Dakota Intercollegiate Conference where defending champion **SOUTH DAKOTA TECH (8-1-0)** will still be the "team-to-beat." The Hardrockers finished the 1980 campaign 11th-ranked nationally and Coach Gary Boner still has 25 lettermen including some key individuals coming back. Leading the veterans will be top running back Doug Beisner (5-10, 185, sr), all-league linebacker Joe Corbett (60, 190, sr) and defensive back Scott Eliason (6-0, 180, jr).

If Tech slips up along the way, both **BLACK HILLS STATE (5-4-0)** and **SIOUX FALLS (5-5-0)** will have the personnel to bid for the SDIC title. Coach Gene Schlekeway's Black Hills club will feature 14 returning starters including all-conference defensive tackle Keith Thompson (6-5, 225), but the Yellowjackets must face a tough non-conference schedule which could prove a handicap. Coach Dave Schroeder did a fine job at Sioux Falls last season and the Cougars are back in force with 32 lettermen and 17 starters. All-conference offensive lineman Steve Leary (6-3, 245, sr) and Bruce Monforte (5-10, 212, sr) are key performers.

Elsewhere in the SDIC, **DAKOTA STATE (5-4-0)** could challenge for the league crown simply on the ability of all-conference quarterback Brian Jacobson (6-1, 200, sr), who was among the national total offense leaders in 1980. **HURON (3-7-0)** will be improved, especially on defense where all-league back Monroe Rostick (6-2, 175, jr) returns and University of Minnesota transfer Jim Anderson (6-4, 240, sr) joins the line. **SOUTH DAKOTA-SPRINGFIELD (2-8-0)** hopes 14 starters returning will mean better things for the Pointers. **DAKOTA WESLEYAN (1-8-0)** had a very disappointing season a year ago despite a lot of seniors. With only nine lettermen and five starters coming back in 1981 it appears things could get even worse for the Tigers.

YANKTON (3-7-0) will play one more season as an independent before joining the SDIC in 1982 and the Greyhounds will again undertake an awesome schedule which includes three nationally-ranked teams. Coach Pete Chapman welcomes back fullback Dominic Livoti (5-11, 220, jr) to run behind a solid offensive line.

Down in the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, the early favorite should be defending champion **HASTINGS (8-1-0)**, which finished as the 13th ranked team in the final NAIA top 20 poll. The Broncos expect 35 lettermen and 17 starters to return for Coach Wendell Maupin including all-conference flanker Tony Ochsner (6-2, 180, jr), all-league tackle Brian Hergenrader (6-0, 200, sr) and defensive end John Hewitt (6-3, 200, sr). Maupin will have a most difficult task replacing graduated all-district quarterback Greg Berens.

Both **MIDLAND LUTHERAN (5-4-0)** and **CONCORDIA (5-5-0)** should offer major obstacles for Hastings to avoid in quest of the NIAC crown. Don

Watchorn's Midland Warriors will number 31 lettermen, but they have been hit hard by graduation in some key areas. Quarterback Steve Carlson (6-0, 180, sr) is a two-year starter with great ability and kicking specialist Hank Schollmeyer (5-10, 185, sr) is one of the best around. Concordia was somewhat of a surprise team last year, but the Bulldogs won't be taken lightly this time around. All-district defensive tackle Gary Pomerence (6-2, 230, jr) and center Tim Voelker (6-2, 220, sr) are individual standouts.

DOANE (4-6-0) is always a very competitive team but the Tigers lost 13 starters including honorable mention All-America running back Kendall Hoggins. **DANA (0-9-0)** had a bunch of freshmen last season and although one year "under-their-belts" will make a difference, the Vikings still have a long way to go.

Among the Nebraska independent teams, **PERU STATE (9-1-0)** will be very good once again after finishing as the 10th ranked team nationally a year ago. All-America running back Alvin Holder (5-9, 195, sr), who led the nation in rushing last season, is back to spark the Bobcats' offense as is field general Mike Haney (6-3, 185, jr) at quarterback. Coach Jerry Joy also takes pride in his defense where monster back Garland Shafer (6-3, 225, sr) is a superior player.

CHADRON STATE (5-5-0) under Coach Jerry Welch is always a scrappy team and the Eagles should improve their record in 1981 with the likes of fullback Willy Long (6-0, 220, jr) and linebacker Ray Hoffman (6-1, 210, sr) returning.

Last season **BAKER KS (9-1-1)** set a national season scoring record and led the country in total offense enroute to a Division II playoff berth. The Wildcats are not expected to be quite as explosive this year, but Coach Charlie Richard will still have a quality squad to battle William Jewell tooth-and-nail once again in the Heart of America Conference race.

A total of 24 lettermen are expected back for the 'Cats, and 14 of those will be returning starters. Baker must install several new people in the skill positions with the graduation of quarterback Chuck Ervin, All-America placekicker

Tony Butts and the transfer of running back Anthony Flanders, the fourth leading rusher in the NAIA last season. Top returnees are wide receiver Bobby Bates (6-2, 180, sr), center Steve Gastelum (6-2, 230, sr) and defensive tackle Joe Lux (6-2, 235).

Among the other Kansas members of the HOAC, **OTTAWA (7-4-0)** could make a serious run for the title as Coach Nyle Salmans welcomes 18 starters back to the Braves' camp. Defense will be especially strong with the return of end John Calderwood (6-2, 210, sr), linebacker Ira Washington (6-1, 180, sr) and cornerback Henry Hill (6-1, 185, jr). **MID-AMERICA NAZARENE (4-7-0)** have made steady progress since joining the league two years ago and the Pioneers should improve even more this season. Top returnees for Coach Gordon DeGraffenreid are safety Jim Couchenour (6-1, 170, sr), defensive end Ken Jolly (6-2, 185, soph) and placekicker Danny Jacques (5-6, 135, sr).

Over in the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference, they've been chasing the Swedes of **BETHANY (9-1-0)** for the past four years and it doesn't appear that pattern will change in 1981. Sixth-year head coach Ted Kessinger, who has compiled a sterling 45-8 record at the small central Kansas school, will have 34 lettermen back to work with but he must replace half of his starters. Halfback Jim Smith (5-9, 175, sr) leads a good offensive team and all-league tackle Cliff Holman (6-0, 215) is back on defense.

ST. MARY OF THE PLAINS (6-4-0) and **KANSAS WESLEYAN (6-4-0)** were somewhat surprise teams finishing in a tie for second in the KCAC a year ago. Both should be treated with the respect of legitimate contenders this time around with an impressive group of returning talent at each school.

At St. Mary of the Plains, Coach Moe Werner has nine starters back on each side of the line. Tailback Mike Romero (6-0, 185, sr) sparks a good offensive unit which also features quarterback Russ Lane (5-9, 175, sr) and all-conference guard Wayne Dillon (5-10, 220, sr). Werner realizes his team's defensive play (last in the KCAC in 1980) must improve. Linebacker Jeff Lindley (5-9, 200, sr) is a standout.

The Coyotes of Kansas Wesleyan return 30 lettermen and 16 starters for new head coach Jon Bingesser. They snapped a 34-game regular season winning streak that Bethany College had going last season in handing the Swedes their first conference loss in three seasons.

Elsewhere in the KCAC, **SOUTHWESTERN (4-5-0)** has a new coach as Dennis Franchione comes over from Kansas State and will have 15 returning starters including quarterback Wade Cargile (5-10, 175, sr). **FRIENDS, (4-5-0)** hopes to get in the title chase with a little better experience in most areas including tight end Steve Walker (6-2, 200, sr) and cornerback Gary Valeddez (5-10, 165, sr). **BETHEL (3-5-1)** will be one of the better defensive teams in the league led by cornerback Aaron Whitfield (5-6, 150, jr) and tackle Randy McPherson (6-2, 230, jr). **MCPHERSON (2-7-0)** is sure to be improved with the addition of some outstanding junior college talent and the return of speedy running back Gerald Henderson (5-11, 195, soph). **STERLING (2-6-1)** will have Curt Bennett back at the coaching reigns after a seven-year absence and the Warriors feature two all-KCAC linebackers in B.J. Hope (6-2, 210, sr) and Mike Beason (6-1, 200, sr). **TABOR (2-7-0)** was a big disappointment last year despite the passing game of quarterback Rod Wallace. Wallace has grad-

uated and the Bluejays hopes for contending are dim.

Kansas independent **BENEDICTINE (3-7-0)** played possibly the toughest Division II schedule in the country last year. The Ravens don't appear to have it much easier in 1981, but Coach Larry Wilcox will have a good nucleus of returnees to undertake the task including offensive threats Terry Torline (6-3, 200, jr) at quarterback and Bill Riddick (6-1, 220, jr) at fullback.

In the Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, **McMURRY (9-2-0)** got its first taste of post-season playoff action last season and would like to come back for second helpings. The Indians under Head Coach Spud Aldridge will have to successfully replace half of their starters to gain a repeat performance. Best among the veterans will be All-America center Luke Taylor (6-2, 252, sr) and running back Dudley Woodard (5-9, 185).

Over at **AUSTIN (8-2-0)**, Larry Kramer has some spots to fill, but the Kangaroos appear to have the talent to be the top threat to McMurry. Leading the returning starters for the K-roos is quarterback Larry Shillings (5-11, 178), the offensive player-of-the-year in the TIAA. Also back is receiver Rory Dukes (5-8, 160, sr), who had 48 receptions in 1980, All-America punter Gene Branum (6-1, 190, sr) and second team All-America safety Chris Luper (5-10, 165, sr).

SUL ROSS STATE (6-4-0) is expected to be in the thick of things with what Coach Joe George calls the finest team in his three years with the Lobos. The Sul Ross passing game will be especially strong with quarterback Larry Hill (6-1, 195, jr) returning and other top talent includes linebacker David Sanchez (6-0, 230, sr) and cornerback Henry Paige (5-9, 170, soph), the freshman player-of-the-year in 1980.

Both **TARLETON STATE (3-7-0)** and **TRINITY (4-6-0)** have some major overhauling to do before they'll be able to challenge for the league crown. Tarleton does have one of the best running backs returning in Ricky Bush (5-10, 185, jr). Over at **LUBBOCK CHRISTIAN (0-10)**, the Chaparrals under new coach Don Carthel will be trying to win their first game against an American College team since the program began in 1979.

Out west in California, the **UNIVERSITY OF REDLANDS (6-3-0)** appears destined to repeat as the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference champs. Under Coach Frank Serrao, the Bulldogs will feature 32 returning lettermen including one of the nation's top running backs, Tony Haertl (6-0, 200, sr). **LAVERNE (1-8-0)** looks to improve on its last place showing in the SCIAC.

Among the independents, **CALIFORNIA LUTHERAN (7-2-1)** is a traditional powerhouse under 20-year head coach Bob Shoup and the Kingsmen should field another quality squad despite the loss of a dozen starters. Craig Moropoulos (6-1, 210, sr) returns at quarterback and should open-up the offense with wide receiver Mark Sutton (6-0, 180, sr) doing most of the catching. On defense, all-district cornerback Jeff Orlando (5-9, 175, sr) and tackle Tad Wygal (6-1, 230, sr) will lead the way.

ST. MARY'S (3-6-0) must find a new quarterback, but the Galloping Gaels have 15 other players returning to their regular positions including standout cornerback Fran McDermott (5-10, 175, sr), all-district guard Dan Mahoney (6-2, 230, sr) and top receiver John Arnaudon (6-0, 180, sr). **AZUSA PACIFIC**

(6-2-0) should have another outstanding season with wide receiver Paul Nath (5-10, 180, sr) and premier defensive tackle Doug Barnett (6-4, 250, sr) returning for Coach Jim Milhon along with 43 other lettermen.

PANHANDLE STATE OK (7-3-0), another independent in Area II, appeared headed for post-season play last year until a rugged late-season schedule hurt them. The Aggies lost receiver-kick return specialist Buddy Fuller to graduation but have 35 lettermen including 15 starters coming back. **COLORADO MINES (4-5-0)** should improve its overall record with 36 lettermen returning led by defensive back and return specialist Roger Flahive (6-2, 190, sr).

If one particular team stands out as a prominent power for 1981 in this area filled with many quality programs, it would probably be **WILLIAM JEWELL MO (11-1-1)**, 1980 national playoff semifinalist which has 44 lettermen and 16 starters coming back on the scene.

National Coach-of-the-Year Stan McGarvey has left for greener pastures at the University of Cincinnati and Vic Wallace inherits a good nucleus of talent with the Cardinals. Among those not returning is graduated running back David Cunningham, the nation's number two rusher last season, but the Cards just might become a little more pass oriented with the talents of quarterback Kelly Groom (6-0, 160, jr) and wide receiver Mike McGill (6-0, 185, sr). Linebacker Gary Ainsworth (6-1, 205, sr) anchors a good defensive unit and placekicker Jerry Burch (6-2, 210, soph) and punter Jeff McGuire (6-2, 195, soph) strengthen the kicking phase of the game.

While Baker University KS will be William Jewell's top opposition in the Heart of America Conference, the Wildcats are in Area II. League contenders in Area III include **MISSOURI VALLEY (7-4-0)** and **GRACELAND IA (6-3-0)**.

Ken Gibler's Missouri Valley Vikings have 13 starters returning but did lose some key performers. Nevertheless, the Vikes always put one of the nation's top defensive units on the field and are expected to contend for a HOA title for that reason. Among the Valley veterans in '81 will be all-conference noseguard Randy Hamilton (6-0, 235, sr), linebacker Mike Fuhr (6-1, 200, jr) and quarterback Trent Mitchell (6-2, 200, sr).

At Graceland, the Yellow Jackets tied Missouri Valley for third last season even though they were rebuilding. Coach Bill Dudek welcomes back 15 starters this year and will enter the 1981 campaign as a legitimate contender for the league crown. Offense should be the Jackets' strongest area where running back Doug Baily (6-1, 205, sr), quarterback Russell Bruch (6-3, 185, sr) and receiver Dave Gavberry (6-3, 195, sr) leads the way.

CULVER-STOCKTON MO (4-6-0) was somewhat of a surprise last season and should be improved. Tight end and linebacker Eric Fencik (6-1, 220, sr) is the top Wildcat returner. **CENTRAL METHODIST MO (2-8-0)** expects 40 lettermen coming back led by honorable mention All-America wide receiver Chuck Thole and quarterback Craig Brown (6-2, 190, jr). **TARKIO MO (0-10-0)** has nowhere to go but up and rookie head coach Scott Swofford, while not expecting to contend for the Heart of America championship, thinks the Owls will be a much better team.

The Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference has always been regarded as one of the top small college football leagues, but the tremendous balance in the MIAC the last two seasons has prevented any of its members from gaining a post-season playoff berth. As many as seven schools are considered legitimate hopefuls for a league title in 1981 and thus the balance factor may again haunt those teams.

Jim Christopherson begins his 12th season at **CONCORDIA (8-2-0)** with an outstanding 85-31-1 career mark, and although the Cobbers have 13 starters to replace, they are expected to be one of the best MIAC teams again. Top returnees for the 1978 national champions are fullback Jim Klug (6-3, 215, sr), who was injured in 1980, defensive end Dave Rosengren (6-3, 215, sr) and middle guard Dwight Hintermeister (6-1, 225, sr).

GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS (7-3-0) lost some of its offensive punch with the graduation of halfback Ron Straka but the Gusties under Coach Dennis Raarup should be an outstanding defensive team with the likes of second team All-America linebacker Dave Najarian (6-4, 226, sr) and safety Greg Laszewski (5-10, 180, sr).

ST. OLAF (6-4-0) might be the top candidate for the pre-season "favorite" role if there is such a thing in the MIAC. The Oles have 34 lettermen coming back for Coach Tom Porter including 15 starters. On offense they have a game-breaking type runner in Bob Klefsaas (5-11, 180, sr) and defense is strong everywhere except up front where two all-conference linemen have graduated.

ST. JOHN'S (5-3-0) would appear to have a struggle ahead of it as the Johnnies lost half their starters from a year ago. Nevertheless, John Gagliardi, the winningest active football coach in the NAIA with over 200 career victories, is sure to field a respectable squad in his 32nd year at the helm. Halfback Lou Raiola (5-11, 185, sr), the leading rusher in the MIAC last year gives the offense punch and end Jim Murphy (6-1, 200, sr) anchors the defense.

ST. THOMAS (3-6-1) experienced an off season in 1980, but new head coach Mark Dienhart has a good group of returnees including 16 starters. The Toms will have to improve significantly to get in the title chase and will rely on veterans like linebacker Steve Nielson (5-11, 205, sr) and defensive tackle

Joe Klinkhammer (6-4, 245, sr) to provide the leadership for an influx of newcomers.

HAMLIN (5-4-0) and **AUGSBURG (5-5-0)** performed beyond expectations last season but both schools will have to install a lot of new faces in starting positions. Hamline lost 14 regulars and will have to rally behind fullback Dick Schroer (6-0, 205, sr) on offense. Augsburg returns a good running back in Dan Roff (5-11, 180, jr) and an exciting kick returner in Dan Nyman (5-10, 170), but the Auggies have some patch-work to do in the interior lines.

Elsewhere in the MIAC, **MACALESTER (1-7-1)** finally broke a national record losing streak with a win and a tie last season, and second-year coach Tom Hosier looks for even more progress with 18 returning starters. **BETHEL (2-8-0)** lost some key people in the skill positions and will struggle to improve its mark in 1981.

In Iowa where all the schools will play an independent schedule, traditional powerhouse **NORTHWESTERN (6-3-0)** should be the cream of the crop where Coach Larry Korver says that he has one of his best defensive teams in years led by all-district linebacker Mark Kruthoff (6-1, 210, sr) and safety Joel Hooegeveen (6-1, 185, jr). Running back Marty Guthmiller (6-1, 195, sr) leads the Red Raiders on offense but they will miss graduated quarterback Mike Calvert and All-America guard Lyle Lundgren.

Over at **WESTMAR (7-3-0)** the Eagles have bordered on being a great team the last two years and it remains to be seen if they have enough talent left to approach that quality again. Leading 14 starters back for new head coach Don Charlson is exciting Angelo James (5-11, 180, jr), a fleet-footed receiver and kick returner. Defensive end Joel Huffman (6-2, 210, jr) is the mainstay of the Eagle defense.

Look for the Duhawks of **LORAS (5-5-0)** to have an outstanding 1981 campaign with 19 starters coming back led by quarterback John Betterman (6-1, 195, soph) and noseguard Mike McDermott (6-0, 225, sr). Running back Dan Edmeier (6-0, 190, jr), who rushed for nearly 1100 yards and a dozen touchdowns last season is an All-America candidate.

IOWA WESLEYAN (4-6-0) should be much better with 18 starters returning led by quarterback Steve Schroeder (6-5, 200, soph) and free safety Kirk Soukup (6-4, 200, jr), who picked off a dozen passes last season. **ST. AMBROSE (3-7-0)** hopes to be improved with 34 returning lettermen including quarterback Jeff Newbery (6-1, 175, jr) and linebacker Tom DiLellio (5-9, 190, jr).

In Wisconsin, two Illini-Badger Conference teams compete with playoff candidate **MILTON (5-3-1)** and rebuilding **LAKELAND (4-6-0)**. Rudy Gaddini's Wildcats at Milton must solve some problems on offense, but will have a good defensive unit led by end Daryl Schleim (6-4, 195, soph), a first team All-American, and cornerback Doug Whitmore (5-11, 172, soph).

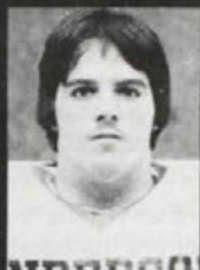
Far-removed **MAINE MARITIME (8-1-0)** had an outstanding season in 1980 and the Mariners anticipate the return of 17 starters including heralded fullback Al Harrison (5-11, 200, jr). The Mariners led the NAIA in total defense last year, but three significant contributors to that unit have graduated.

There is little doubt that the strength in this area centers around the Hoosier-Buckeye Conference, which has established itself as one of the better small college football leagues in the country. The 1980 race ended in a three-way tie for first place between national runner-up **WILMINGTON OH (10-2-0)**, quarterfinal playoff participant **HANOVER IN (8-2-0)** and **ANDERSON IN (8-1-0)**, which just missed the eight-team playoffs and finished as the nation's number nine ranked team. When you consider that 1979 national champion **FINDLAY OH (5-4-0)** could do no better than fourth in this conference last season, one can well expect that some of the top Division II football will be played in this league again in 1981.

At Wilmington, Coach Bill Ramseyer's Quakers got within one victory of a national championship despite having a team with numerous underclassmen. With 34 lettermen returning including eight starters on each side of the line, the Quakers are certain to be among the top teams in the country once again. Leading the veterans will be All-America running back Gary Worthy (6-0, jr), the nation's leading scorer last year, while on defense linebacker Jim Schiller (6-0, 200, sr), tackle Mike Doerger (6-1, 218, jr), linebacker Robert Byrd (5-11, 200, jr) and safety Ed Minor (6-2, 188, sr) anchor a solid unit. Ramseyer must come up with a capable replacement for second team All-America quarterback John Calhoun and versatile fullback Russell Williams, both lost to graduation. Four major college transfers are expected to be of immediate help.

Hanover must have a few thoughts of revenge in its mind, still stinging a bit from a 56-49 four-overtime loss to Wilmington in the first round of last year's playoffs. The Panthers also return an experienced group with 40 lettermen and 17 starters expected back to camp. On offense, Hanover can hit you by land with honorable mention All-America back Gary Cushing (5-11, 185, sr) or by air with talented receivers Jeff Carter (5-10, 170, sr), a second team All-America pick, and tight end Jeff Walton (6-3, 220, sr). Defensively, the graduation of All-America linebacker Don Katzman leaves a void in the middle, but a talented secondary which led the nation in interceptions and ranked second overall in pass defense returns intact. A big question for Head Coach Pete Compise is his kicking game where both his kicking specialist and punter have exited.

Anderson will be very strong once again and has declared that it will be one of the national playoff teams in 1981 after missing the field last year with a loss to Hanover on the last day of the regular season. The Ravens under Coach Kevin Donley have 43 lettermen set to return and will again pride themselves on defense where they recorded five shutouts and ranked fifth overall in the nation in 1980. Leading that side of the line is honorable mention All-America selections Garry Wood (6-2, 250, jr) at noseguard, tackle Chuck Rhudy (6-3, 240, sr) and linebacker Jeff Evrard (6-2, 220, sr). The Ravens also led the conference in total offense in 1980 and are paced in that department by tackle Norbert Schenhals (6-4, 248, sr) and center Kurt Bolden (6-2, 258, jr). Anderson should have a real edge in the schedule department where they play all of the top Hoosier-Buckeye contenders at home this season.

If anybody is capable of sneaking-up on the incumbents in the HBC race it would probably be **DEFIANCE OH (4-5-0)** where Coach Gary Schaefer has 17 experienced starters coming back and is concerned only about his depth. The Yellowjackets boast three defensive stalwarts in linebacker Walt Turner (6-0, 205, sr), end Bob Bomholt (6-2, 205, sr) and middle guard Kyle Cole (5-10, 195, jr). Findlay is still rebuilding and is expected to have only six seniors on the squad this season. The Oilers under Dick Strahm will miss All-America running back Nelson Bolden, whose departure creates their biggest void. All-district defensive end Jerry Campbell (6-3, 220, sr) and offensive tackle Mike Myers (6-4, 250, sr) are the top Oiler returnees.

Elsewhere in the league, **EARLHAM IN (3-6-0)** and **TAYLOR IN (2-7-0)** should be the most improved teams but appear to lack the talent to compete as a legitimate title contender. Tailback Gerry Keesling (5-9, 180, sr) and offensive tackle Brice Sayne (6-4, 255, sr) are individual standouts for Earlham, while Taylor's John Ozmun (6-1, 180, sr) is versatile as both a running back and kicker. **BLUFFTON (2-6-1)** has an outstanding defensive back in Jamie Fox (5-10, 205, jr) and **MANCHESTER (0-9-0)** is strong up front with defensive tackle Ron Harnish (6-2, 250, sr), but neither school is expected to make any great strides in improving their records.

More strength in Area IV may come from the eastern sector this season where both **WESTMINSTER PA (5-3-0)** and **WAYNESBURG PA (5-3-0)** will have strong units and be among the top independents. Ten-year Head Coach Joe Fusco, who has won three national titles at Westminster, welcomes back 35 lettermen and 17 starters. The Titans, normally one of the top defensive teams in the country, may be stronger on offense this year led by a good backfield of all-district halfback Steve Ferringier (5-11, 175, sr), fullback John DeGruttola (6-0, 220, jr) and quarterback Rich Dalrymple. Graduation hit the defensive front and linebacking corps including All-America tackle Dan Brougher.

Like Westminster, Waynesburg will have 17 returning starters but will undertake a brutal independent schedule. The Yellow Jackets appear to have a fine arsenal of offensive weapons with all-district running back Keith Davis (5-11, 180, sr), tight end Dom DeCicco (6-4, 252, sr) and standout center Mike Kaldor (6-2, 228, sr). Strong safety Sam Procida (5-11, 181, sr) leads the defensive unit which needs incoming help on the frontline if Coach Hayden Buckley's squad has hopes for post-season play. The Golden Tornadoes of

GENEVA PA (4-5-0) have an explosive offense returning led by tailback Bob Perrotta (5-6, 160, sr) and a quality interior line but does not appear to be a playoff contender because of defensive shortcomings.

Over in the western section of Area IV, it does not appear that any of the teams have improved themselves a great deal and most will rely on newcomers. In the Illini-Badger Conference, **CONCORDIA IL (3-6-0)** is strong on defense but must find receivers for strong-arm quarterback Dave Garrow (5-11, 175, soph). **NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS (4-7-0)** lost two All-America performers and has a depleted defensive corps. **EUREKA IL (3-5-1)** may be improved with 39 lettermen expected back on the scene but must get better blocking for halfback Carl Perkins (5-6, 165, sr).

FRANKLIN IN (8-2-0) could be a playoff contender if the Grizzlies declare for NAIA play but won't be quite as deep this season. The return of quarterback Steve Wray (6-2, 205, jr), who was hurt most of last season after leading the nation in passing in 1979 will be a big plus for Coach Stewart Faught's squad.

ILLINOIS WESLEYAN (7-2-0) finished as the 17th-ranked team in the national ratings last year, but Coach Don Larson's Titans will miss running back Britt Travis and All-America linebacker Rick Hanna. Placekicker Dave Pearce (6-2, 170, jr) is a highly valuable commodity.

ILLINOIS COLLEGE (3-6-0) has 17 starters returning in 1981 but one of the missing is all-time leading scorer and rusher Jay Wessler whose absence will be a major blow to the Blueboys' offense. **OLIVET NAZARENE IL (5-4-0)** is in a similar situation with 17 starters coming back but minus a top offensive weapon with the graduation of quarterback Jeff Habedank.

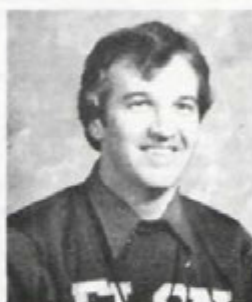

THE NAIA IN PERSPECTIVE

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) currently administers programs of intercollegiate athletics to more than 500 fully-accredited four-year colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada.

The basic concept upon which the philosophy of the NAIA is focused is that the intercollegiate athletic programs of member institutions should be an integral part of the total educational program, subject to the same aims, policies and objectives as are other departments and programs.

The philosophy of the NAIA is geared to those colleges and universities of moderate enrollment that administer their varsity sports programs on a sound educational and financial basis. The NAIA is not in competition with any other organization and seeks to support and compliment those with similar philosophies and goals.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball, the NAIA emanated from a national small college basketball tournament inaugurated in 1937. The NAIA conducts district, area and national competition in 15 championship events for men and 10 events for women. The women's division of competition was instituted in the NAIA program during the 1980-81 season.

Football, which became part of the men's program in 1956, had just one division of competition until 1969. Division II became a part of the championship picture in 1970 after a year-long study of the membership and an endorsement by the NAIA Football Coaches Association.

The NAIA inaugurated playoffs to determine its team for the championship in 1958. Four teams made up the playoff field in each division until 1978 when the championship series was expanded to include eight teams, going from two weekends and seven playoff games to three weekends and 14 playoff games.
