NEW YORK (AP) — Quarterback Mike Machurek, who capped Idaho State's rags-to-riches saga by leading the Bengals to the NCAA Division I-AA national championship, was named today to The Associated Press College Division 1981 All-America football team.

During the regular season, Machurek led Division I-AA in passing efficiency, completing 188 of 313 attempts for 2,752 yards and 22

touchdowns. Idaho State won its first Big Sky Conference title in 18 years after going 0-11 just two years ago.

Joining Machurek on the first team were three repeaters from 1980 — defensive tackle Randy Trautman of Boise State and defensive backs William Dillon of Virginia Union and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky.

The running backs are Alvin Holder of Peru (Neb.) State, Milson Jones of North Dakota and Paris Wicks of Youngstown (Ohio) State. Holder finished his career as the NAIA's second all-time leading rusher with 5,023 yards, averaging 139.6 yards a game for his career. In 1981, he averaged 156.4 yards a game. Wicks carried 245 times for 1,363 yards this season and led Division I-AA in scoring with 17 touchdowns.

Jones, an all-around performer, rushed for 1,112 yards, caught 24 passes for 206 yards, returned nine kickoffs for 248 yards and punted 56 times for a 39.1 average.

The tight end is Clarion State's Gary McCauley and the wide receiver is Dwight Walker of Nicholls State in Louisiana. The interior line consists of tackles Mike

Fields of Jackson (Miss.) State and Bob Speight of Boston University, guards Mike Broome of Hillsdale and Kevin Greve of Eastern Kentucky and center Mike Udovich of Millersville (Pa.) State. The placekicker is Tony Zendejas of Nevada-Reno, who connected on 21 of 24 field goal tries.

Joining Trautman, Dillon and Floyd on the defensive unit are ends Donnie Evans of Western Kentucky and Booker Reese of Bethune-Cookman, tackle Malcolm Taylor of Tennessee State, middle guard Bob Jackson of Puget Sound, linebackers Andre Robinson of Grambling (La.) State, Joe Skladany of Lafayette and Clayton Weishuhn of Angelo (Tex.) State, back Wayne Schluchter of North Dakota State and punter Case deBruijn of Idaho State.

Nine Lions Gridders Named To NAIA All-District 16 Team

Missouri Southern State College's football Lions placed nine performers on the NAIA District 16 football.

Six of the Southern choices earned All-Central States Intercollegiate honors recently. They are junior offensive lineman Joel Tupper, senior wide receiver John Anderson, freshman running back Harold Noifalise, senior defensive tackle Kelly Saxton, senior linebacker Stan Gardner and sophomore returner Steve Sater.

Lions teammates also earning first-team, all-district

honors were senior punter Mark Stufflebeam, junior defensive back Glenn Baker and junior offensive tackle Pete Sellen.

Second-team laurels went to Lions juniors Ron Harris, running back, and John Lindsay, defensive back.

The Lions included five players on the honorable mention list — sophomore tight end Kevin Moyer, sophomore offensive tackle Billy Jack Smith, junior defensive end Rock Overman and junior linebacker Mark Bock.

Saxton, Gardner and An-

derson have been nominated by District 16 officials for All-American honors. Other District nominees for national recognition are Guy Weber and Robert Ainsworth, William Jewell; Tim Hoskins and Robert Newhart, Missouri Western; Randy Hamilton, Missouri Valley; Rick Fencik, Culver-Stockton and John Picolo, Evangel.

Missouri Western Coach Rob Hiekin was named District 16 Coach of the Year. The Golden Griffons finished their season with a 9-2 record. The setbacks came in CSIC play against Pittsburg State and Missouri Southern.
