

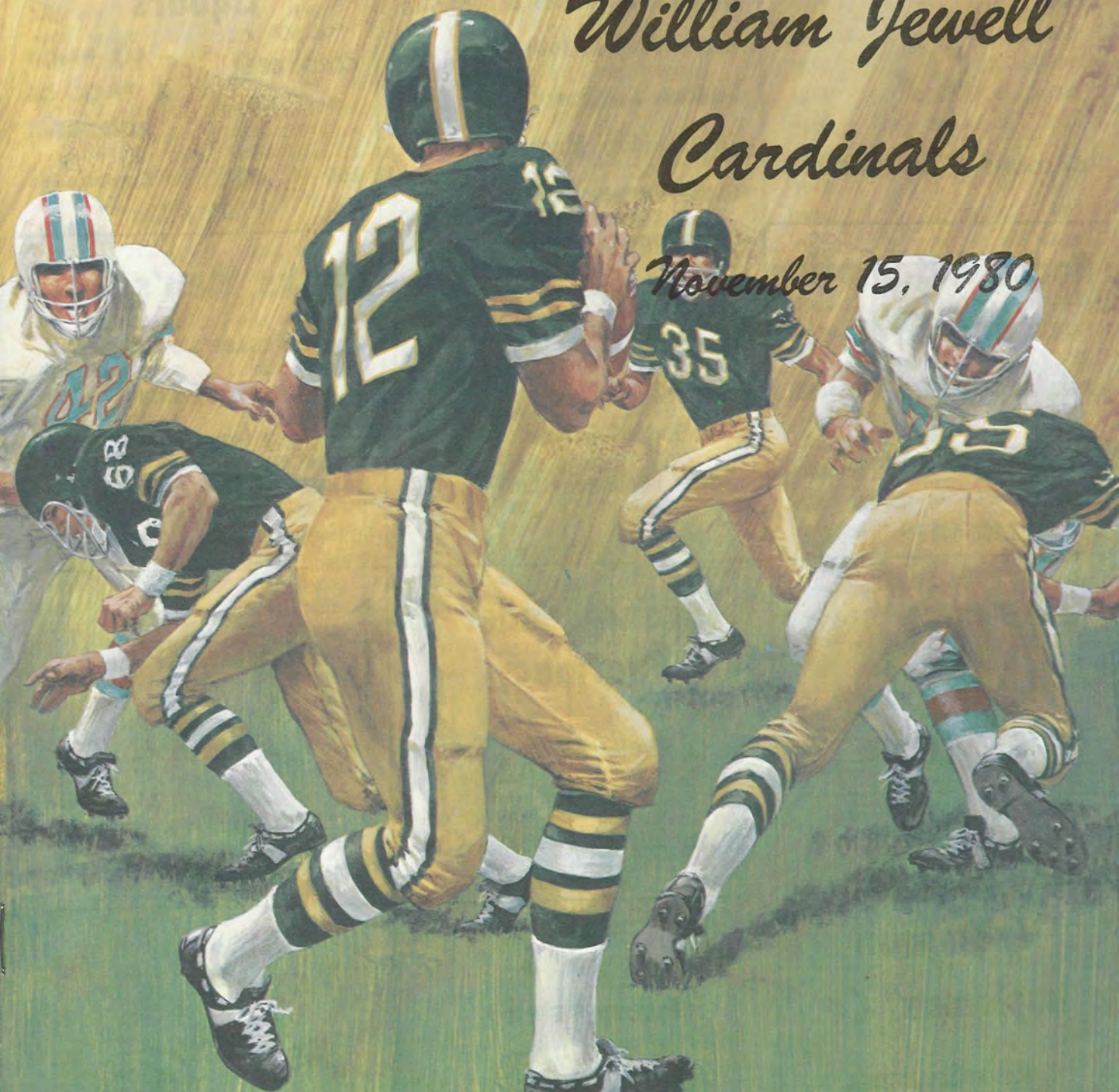

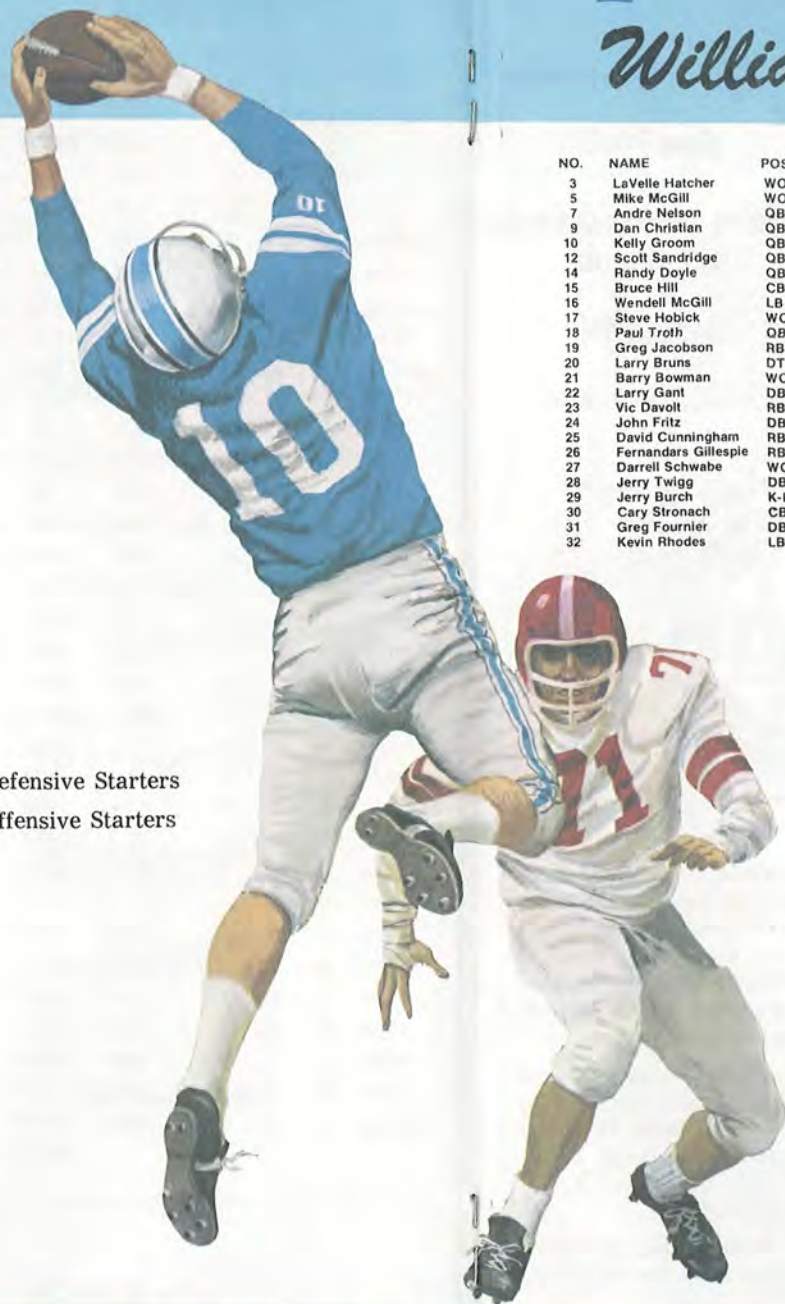

Culver-Stockton College

Culver-Stockton College, founded in 1853, was the first institution West of the Mississippi River chartered expressly for the education of both men and women in a co-educational setting.

Culver-Stockton College was originally founded as Christian University by Dr. Pat Henderson and other Christian (Disciples of Christ) Church leaders prior to the Civil War. Dr. James Shannon was named the first president.

The College suspended classes briefly during the Civil War, as Federal troops occupied Old Main, the original building standing on the present site of Henderson Hall. When Old Main burned in 1903, it was replaced by the present Henderson Hall Building.

Mr. Robert Stockton and Mrs. Mary Culver, of St. Louis, played a vital role in the school's history with generous donations for residence halls, a new gymnasium, and grants for faculty salaries. In recognition of their generosity, the trustees changed the name of the institution to Culver-Stockton College in 1917.

The success of any college can be judged by the success of its graduates. Referring to the 1978 Alumni Directory of Culver-Stockton College, it can be noted that 126 Culver alumni hold faculty or administrative positions in colleges or universities throughout the country. One hundred and fifty-two



are practicing, ordained ministers, 185 either own their own business, are in partnership, are the chief executive officer, president or chairman of the board of a corporation. Forty-six are practicing medical doctors, 52 hold a master of business administration (MBA) or certified public accountant (CPA) degree. Forty-two are practicing attorneys or judges.

Culver-Stockton College, a four-year, liberal arts college, is located on an 111-acre campus in Canton, Missouri, one mile west of and 100 feet above the mighty and majestic Mississippi River. The college offers the B.S., B.M., B.A., and B.F.A. degrees in 35 major areas of study.

A 1973 graduate of Cardinal O'Hara High School in Buffalo, N. Y., where he earned All-City

honors as a prep, Okruch enjoyed a brilliant career at C-S. He was a four year letterman in football as an offensive end, and a three year letterman in baseball. He received two athletic awards his senior year in football.

Okruch served as an assistant at C-S during the 1977 season before becoming the Q.B. and receiver coach at Northeast Missouri State University for the 1978-79 campaigns. He returns to his alma mater with hopes of returning the respectability to Wildcat football. Okruch is 24 years old and resides in Canton.
