## Cardinals Seek to Untie Knot in Playoff Rematclı <br> by Scott Burton

Book Two of William Jewell-Baker football superiority resumes Saturday afternoon at 1 p.m. in Greene Stadium.
Jewell, ranked second in the final NAIA Division II poll, and third-ranked Baker square off in first round action of post season play this weekend.
Other first round games include eighthranked Valley City State, N.D. (7-0) traveling to seventh-rated McMurry, Tex. (9-1). Number five Hanover, Ind. (8-1) tackles Wilmington, Ohio (7-1) and top-ranked Linfield, Ore. (9-0) challenges fourth-ranked Pacific Lutheran (8-1).

Jewell and Baker battled to a $10-10$ tie two weeks ago. They shared the Heart of America Athletic Conference crown with 7-0-1 marks. The Cardinals stand at $10-0-1$ overall and Baker is $9-0-1$. Saturday's game will not end in a tie because of an overtime provision in the playoffs.
