Jewell reaches finals

William Jewell has advanced to the NAIA Division II national football championship game, by defeating top-ranked Northwestern College of Iowa, 23-10, Saturday at Greene Stadium in Liberty.

The Cardinals, 10-1, will meet Linfield College of Oregon, 11-0, at McMinnville, Ore. Saturday at 2:30 p.m. (CDT.)

Jewell intercepted seven Northwestern passes to thwart the Red Raiders'

high-powered offense. Mike Newman and Paul Taylor each had a trio of pass thefts, and Mike Switzer had one.

Kelly Groom threw touchdown passes of 78 and 28 yards to Jimi Reed to

boost Jewell to a 14-0 first-quarter lead. Steve Hodges, who gained 145 yards on 29 carries for the day, increased the Cardinals' lead to a 21-0 on a 61-yard run in the second quarter.

Jewell led, 21-3, at halftime.

Guy Weber sacked Northwestern quarterback Lee McKinstrey in the end zone for a fourth-quarter safety.

The Red Raiders, who entered the game with a 11-0 record, scored on a 23-yard field goal by Steve Rhodes and a one-yard run by McKinstrey.

The Cardinals outrushed Northwestern, 253-91 yards, but the Red Raiders held a 402-158 edge in passing.

Jewell will be making its first appearance in the finals Saturday, after semifinal losses the last two seasons.
