

Welcome to Baker University and to Liston Stadium! The trustees, faculty, administration, students, and alumni are happy to have you here for the game!


Baker continues to stress quality educational programs and to field strong teams. We strive also to be a caring community for all individuals.





Girardi Answers The Big One. . . .

In an interview with Head Coach Joseph Girardi this past week he answered the following questions.

(Q) WHAT IS YOUR OUTLOOK ON THIS WEEK'S GAME AGAINST WILLIAM JEWELL?

"The Cardinals are beatable, out we will have to play our best ball to win. We will have to stop making so many mental mistakes. Our guys will have to come out fired up and ready to win. This intensity level must be maintained for sixty minutes of play. The team that wins is the team that wants the game the most."

(Q)WHY DID WE ATTEMPT THE ONSIDE KICK AND THE TWO POINT CONVERSION LAST WEEK WHEN WE WERE AHEAD BY TWENTY POINTS?

"We were practicing everything we had in our playbook. We knew Jewell was in the stands and we wanted them to prepare for us. The more things we give them to think about the better our offense will operate. We will give them a lot of different looks and we have been working on some other special plays."

(Q) DOES BAKER STILL HAVE A CHANCE AT A BOWL BID?

"If we beat Jewell we should go to the Masonic Temple Bowl Game in St. Joseph, Mo. That is the impression I received from the committee. They will be making their decision sometime next week." (Q) WILL EWING AND HARGROVE BE ABLE TO PLAY THIS WEEK AGAINST JEWELL:

"Both of these guys are seniors and it's their last home game at Baker. You bet they will be ready to go. They are both so competitive that Saturday it will be impossible to keep them out of the line-up. Ewing will have to play his best game as a Wildcat for the 'Cats offense to move. He will have to be the inspirational leader in tonight's ballgame."

(Q) WHAT WERE YOUR IMPRESSIONS OF THE J.V.'S WIN OVER KANSAS UNIVERSITY'S J.V.?

"The kids played great and they deserved to win that ballgame. With the money and facilities the Jayhawks have they should have blown us out of the stadium. But our kids are tough and you really see what kind of athletes you have when you go against these bigger schools. Our kids out hit them and scored when they had too. These kids go out on the field and prove to us coaches that they want to play football. The J.V. has played well all season and I know that this experience will make them very valuable to our program next year."

(Q) THE INEVITABLE QUESTION COMES UP EVERY YEAR IF YOU WILL BE BACK NEXT YEAR. SO COACH WILL YOU RETURN AT THE HELM FOR THE CATS NEXT SEASON?

"As long as they want a good football program around here I will be here. But when they indicate they don't want that type of program I will move on."

Kenny for the past three seasons has been the immovable object on the Wildcats defensive line. Even with these injuries he has played well and given the opposing team something to think about. Kenny is the nicest guy you want to meet during the week, but on Saturday when he steps on the field he becomes a different person. He is always pressuring the offense into making mistakes for the Wildcats to capitalize on.

These are only four of the Wildcat players, so sit back and get ready for one of the best games in Baker's history.

The 'Cats defense rose to the test and held the Jayhawks forcing them to punt. The 'Cats got the ball back with 4:50 left in the game, kept the ball on the ground and ran valuable time off the clock. With about two minutes left Baker punted the ball to the four yard line where the Hawks fumbled and it was recovered by Mitch McInally. It was McInally's second fumble recovery of the game. Ervin took the ball in with only :18 seconds left on the clock from one yard out. The PAT was no good making the final score 23-14, Baker.


