

William "Duke" Dudek is now in his eighth year as Head Coach of the Yellowjackets. Duke, a 1965 Graceland graduate, took over the football pentor's job in 1975. Included in that space of time are one Deart of America Conference Tri-Championship, two second place runner-up seasons, a Bowl game, and an 8-2 season which was the best in Graceland's history as a four-year institution.

Duke's team has been ranked as high as number four in the nation during the regular season at two different times, fifth another time, and has finished the season in fourteenth and seventeenth place in the final season's polls. Since 1973 Graceland has produced six MI-Americans, four Honorable Mentions and numerous All-Conference and All-District selections.

Duke was an outstanding athlete while a student at Graceland. He competed not only in football but track, basketball and baseball, carning thirteen letters.

Duke and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three children: Bill (10), Cari (8), and Kelly (6).


Presently, Jerry is also Head Wrestling Coach and a Professor in the Physical Education Department.

A 1973 graduate of Graceland, Tom and his wife, Peggy, have three daughters: Stacey, Carey and Katie.












Dennis Thompson, a 1980 Graceland alumna begins his 2nd season as an assistant coach for the Yellowjackets.


Dennis and his new bride, Amy, are operating the Tri-County Fertilizer Plant in Lamoni. Dennis is working with the offensive line and specialty team.






