


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

THE EARLY DAYS OF BAKER FOOTBALL

1931

*"The Big Game — 50 Years Ago" Reprint from Nov. 9, 1931 Baker Orange
"Wildcats Rally to Gain Tie Score with Cardinal Eleven."*

"The thirteen year jinx held by the Baker University Wildcats held good for at least another year when the two teams battled to a 7 to 7 tie on Muehlebach field Saturday afternoon.

The Jewell Cardinals might claim a moral victory out of the game, for in the long number of years the games have been played in Kansas City, Saturday's tie game was the nearest the Cardinals have ever come to winning.

With the Red Clad team holding a 7 to 0 lead at the start of the final quarter, the Baptists sensed a victory that would break the many lean years and begin a string of victories. But the famous passing combination, Stock to Cookson, ruled otherwise. Only half of the fourth quarter remained when "Hoddy" Stock tossed a short pass to Cookson and before (the) startled Cardinals could recover their wits, the speedy Cookson was over the goal line.

The playing of the two rival safety men, Frank Cookson, and Polly Grant, added color to the rather colorless game. They excelled in running back punts. The personal dual between the Jewell All-State star and Cookson who is certain to land an all-conference berth, was a great exhibition of technique in broken field running.

Grant gave Baker fans several anxious moments late in the game by daring returns of punts. But the Jewell star was unable to break loose for the winning score. The game ended with the ball in possession of the Wildcats on the Jewell 37 yard line."

rival except for two short-lived advantages produced by the Braves diminutive halfback Keith Brooks at the beginning of each of the first two periods.

Taking the opening kickoff the Ottawa team moved to the initial score 6-0, the conversion attempt was wide.

The Wildcats fighting back tied it up moments later as Bud Bender, senior halfback who was playing his final collegiate football game, leading Baker's rushing attack smashed over for the Wildcat's initial score. Big Bob Shores converted giving the victors a 7-6 lead at the quarter.

In the second stanza Ottawa's fleet halfback, Brooks, gave them their second and last lead as he swept right end three yards to pay dirt. The conversion again was wide leaving the losers with their game total of 12 points.

Perry Miller's first score, a plunge over from about six yards out, gave the 'Cats a lead which they never relinquished. Shores again converted giving Baker a 14-12 halftime advantage.

Buddy Bender started the third quarter fireworks, Baker's most fruitful of the season by punching over a quick six-pointer. Gene Perry and Perry Miller did likewise with Miller crossing the goal line twice. Shores booted three extra points to complete the quarter's scoring activities of 27 points. The fourth period saw Coach Karl Spear substituting freely and still adding to his commanding lead. With about eight minutes left in the game freshman halfback, Harry Bean, broke loose with one of the games best runs as he rambled 50 yards for the final score.

The victory gave Baker a season's record of four wins and five setbacks.



Coach Brings Winning Past to Baker



Coach Richard, Nancy, Amy and Patrick.

Coach Charlie Richard, a native of Grain Valley, MO, begins his second season as head coach of the Wildcats. He is coaching his 18th year after a varied background that includes ten years at the high school level and eight years at the college level.

In his first job at Odessa High School in Missouri Coach Richard turned a completely dead athletic program into a big winner. His philosophy of wanting the student athlete to participate in as many sports as possible developed and prospered there. He was also the head basketball coach, head track coach, and athletic director at Odessa.

Moberly High School was the next program to be renovated and molded by Richard's capable hands. A program which previously consisted of only 30 players was turned into a big winner with over 100 players. A new facility was built, and one of the most competitive athletic programs in the state was developed under Richard as he worked as athletic director, head football coach, and head track coach.

After ten very successful years at the high school level, Richard turned to college coaching. A year of graduate work at Central Missouri State University where he also served as defensive coordinator, gave him the experience he needed to make the decision that college coaching was going to be his way of life.

In his next position as head football coach at Highland Junior College, he developed a losing program into a very competitive and class program. Here he earned the reputation of an excellent recruiter and player developer. He was also athletic director and head track coach. His 1976 women's track team finished third in the nation among junior colleges.

Richard then went to Illinois State University to coach the Red-bird offensive backs. While there he recruited several outstanding athletes and developed many of the contacts that help his outstanding recruiting today.

National power Coffeyville Junior College was his next stop where he coordinated one of the top defensive teams in the nation for two years. He was also the track coach for the Ravens.

In his first year at Baker Coach Richard combined a good returning nucleus with transfers and outstanding freshmen to lead Baker to its first national playoff berth and its many national statistic championships.

"Our players worked very hard, our coaches did an outstanding teaching job and everyone got involved to make 1980 a 'dream year' for me at Baker University," Richard said.

"The dream is over and 1981 brings ten tremendous challenges to our football squad. Each Saturday our football team will face a tough situation. I am proud to be a part of our 1981 Baker Football program and to have the opportunity to work with a great group of young men," the Coach said.

Richard is a graduate of William Jewell where he met his lovely wife Nancy. They have two children Pat, 13, and Amy, 9.

Offensive Line

Keith Hackett of W. Nyack, NY, will again be coaching the offensive line for Baker University this fall. Hackett, 27, was a four year starter at Tarkio College and earned many honors as an offensive lineman. He was chosen all-conference, all-district, Captain '75, MVP '75, Outstanding Offensive Lineman '73, and Outstanding Specialist in '74. In 1976 he was named head football and wrestling coach at Mid-Buchanan High School in Faucett, MO. From there he came to Baker as an assistant where he has served as offensive line coach for three years. His '81 offensive line allowed one quarterback sack. As head baseball coach for three years, his '81 squad was Heart of America Conference Co-Champs. Keith and his wife Pat have a daughter Katie, 1 year old.



Linebackers

Murray Stenzel is starting his second year as linebacker coach for the Wildcats in 1981. Stenzel, 25, is a graduate of Wichita West High School here he played football and was selected to the all-city team. He then attended Coffeyville JuCo where he played on the 1975, 11-0, Wool Bowl championship team. He was a key blocker for Ron Springs, now a Dallas Cowboy. A graduate of Washburn University, Stenzel has been head football and head women's basketball coach at Valley Falls High School in Valley Falls, KS. He increased the squad from 19 to 40 members in one season. His 1979-80 women's basketball team was substate champions.



Secondary

Dale Richard, a veteran high school coach, will be starting his second year as secondary coach for the Wildcats this season. He is a graduate of Grain Valley High School where he played football, basketball, and track. He then played football and baseball at Central Methodist College. Richard coached junior high football at Moberly, MO for two years where his teams were 8-1. He then moved to Blue Springs, MO for one year before taking the head football, head women's basketball, and assistant track job at Horton High School in Horton, KS. There he built the program into respectability and his 1979-80 women's basketball team finished in the state quarter-finals. The 31 year old coach and his wife Kathie have two children, Duane, 13, and Karen, 12.



Defensive Ends

Tight Ends

Tom Irvin, 26, will be coaching the defensive ends and tight ends for the Wildcats in 1981. Tom is a graduate of Central Missouri State University where he started four years as cornerback and free safety earning MIAA honors. Tom coached at Southwest High School in Kansas City in 78-79 as the assistant football and head golf coach. For the past two years he was offensive coordinator and head wrestling coach at Center High School in Kansas City.



Defensive Coordinator

Brian Byers, 24, from Waterloo, Iowa, will be the defensive coordinator this season. Brian is a graduate of Pittsburg State University where he played football and earned the following honors: Kodak All-American, AP All-American, All-American, All district, all conference, most valuable offensive player, and most valuable offensive lineman. Brian comes to Baker after three years experience as an assistant football coach at Pittsburg State University.



Offensive Backs

Stan Higley will coach the Wildcat offensive backfield this fall. Stan is a graduate of Colby Community College and Fort Hays State University and has earned four varsity wrestling letters. As an assistant football coach and head wrestling coach for Baldwin High School, Stan has been fortunate to work with some outstanding coaches, teams, and individual athletes in a wide variety of areas. During his three years at Baldwin, the football teams were Jayhawk League Champions, and for the past two years he coached wrestlers who qualified for the State Wrestling Meet. Stan is 29 years old, single, and active in Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite, and a member of the York Rite and Eastern Star.

BAKER WILDCATS VS. WILLIAM JEWELL CARDINALS



November 7, 1981

Baker University would like to congratulate and pay tribute to their fine group of 19 senior football players who will be playing in their last home game for the Wildcats tonight against William Jewell.

In the offensive backfield Baker will lose to graduation perhaps the best backfield combination in the nation in BEN REED and TAYLOR GILL. Reed, a transfer from Illinois State, has already rushed for over 1000 yards this season and still has two games to play. Gill, a three year starter for Baker is the schools' all time leading rusher with 2883 career yards heading into tonight's game. Taylor was a 2nd team All-Conference selection last year.

BOBBY BATES heads the best of receivers Baker will miss next year. Bates, a Baker team captain has been All-Conference since his sophomore year and All-American honorable mention his junior year. JOE LEDFORD has been Bakers' starting tight end for the past two years. Ledford has the respect around the Heart of America Conference for his blocking ability and soft hands. Returning after a year off is DAN BOXELL at receiver who has stepped in and been a big asset to the Cats'. DAVE HOUSTON rounds out the receiving core and is probably one of the best athletes on the B.U. team. Dave has played slot back, split end, returned kicks and at one time in his Baker career filled in as reserve quarterback when injuries arose. "Snake" and Dan also play baseball for the Cats'.

The Wildcats will lose the four best offensive linemen in the country with statistics to back them. This quartet of STEVE GASTELUM, BRETT STONE, GREG JONES, and STEVE JACKSON glued together as starters last year. Their hard work and effort helped Baker capture the scoring, total offense and team rushing titles in the NAIA last year and are challenging for all three this year. Gastelum and Jones were both All-Conference selections last year.

Defensively, the Cats' have four ends graduating in MIKE BREJDA, LIN MANDERSHIED, RIC NEPOTE, and MARK YULICH. Brejda has been a starter for Baker when he wasn't hurt the past two seasons. Mandershied and Nepote are transfers that have really solidified the Baker defense. Mark Yulich may not have been the most talented B.U. player, but where hard work and team spirit are concerned he was one of the best.

Losses to the defensive line are JOE LUX, STAN WATCHOUS, and DANNY LEE. Lux was All-Conference, All-District and is an All-American candidate this year. Stan Watchous was playing alot last year but suddenly suffered a serious knee injury. He worked hard in the off-season after an operation and has become B.U.'s starting linebacker. Danny Lee transferred to Baker for his final year and has added stability to the defensive line.

The defensive secondary seniors that will be playing in their final home game are MIKE RUTHERFORD and LARRY EPPS. Both helped Baker set a conference interception record last season with 32 (Epps snatched eight). With Mike and Larry in the secondary, opponents have only been able to complete a little 30% of their passes this year.

"This is one of the finest senior classes to graduate from any small college in America. It is a group of hard working, loyal, dedicated young men who have given their best effort on the field and in the classroom. Baker University may never have another class of so many outstanding young men. It has been a real honor to coach these young men and I know each will be successful in his life's endeavors because of the hard work and dedication they have shown at Baker," commented Coach Richard.
