

Dr. Thomas Field proclaims Saturday night as Farmland Industries Night at William Jewell

When the William Jewell Cardinals place their 7-0 record, their number two ranking in the Division II NAIA polls and the lead in the Heart of America Conference on the line against Missouri Valley College, they will do so before a huge partisan crowd at Green Stadium in Liberty. Farmland Industries has purchased 1500 tickets to the

Saturday night contest and with their president, John Anderson of Liberty, will be cheering the Cardinals to another victory.

The Cardinals are expecting Saturday's attendance to be the largest on record for the season and urge all their fans to pick up their tickets early at the athletic office on the Jewell campus.

Farmland Industries has long

been a close friend to William Jewell through their CO-OP program and feel that it is especially fitting for the Cardinals to face this pivotal game before such close friends and loyal supporters.

The fans should be treated to an explosive offensive show on the part of William Jewell. Robin Schermerhorn (senior,

Great Mills, MD), Cardinal wide receiver has had 23 receptions for 535 yards and 10 touchdowns. All of these receptions came from senior Mark Capra (Kansas City) who has 61 completions in 114 attempts for 14 touchdowns and 842 yards. Defensively, Jim Koch (sophomore, Maryland Heights), Jack Stasi (senior, Kansas City), Bruce Hill (junior, O'Fallon), Wayne Schmidt (sophomore, N. Tonawanda, NY) and Gary Ainsworth (sophomore, Boonville) hope to contain the Missouri Valley offensive threat along with the other regulars. Since this is the

last home game of the season, each senior will be introduced before the game rather than during the traditional starting line-ups.

Dr. Field, who is in his last year at the helm of William Jewell College, is particularly excited about the efforts of this year's Cardinal team and will be on hand Saturday night for all the festivities. Guest announcer for the night will be Don Fortune, sportscaster for TV-9, Metromedia Television. Halftime activities will feature the Winnetonka Marching Band.
