LIBERTY, MO. (AP) — Marty Hensley scored two touchdowns and Jerry Burch added two field goals Saturday to lead William Jewell to a 19-14 win over No. 1-ranked Pacific Lutheran in NAIA Division II quarterfinal college football.

The Cardinals, ranked No. 2 in the NAIA, intercepted five Pacific Lutheran passes and held the Lutes to just 24 yards rushing on 30 carries.

William Jewell (11-0) will travel to Sherman, Texas, Dec. 5 to meet Austin College in semifinal action.

William Jewell Upsets No. 1 Pac-Lutheran

LIBERTY, Mo. (UPI) — Quarterback Kelly Groom combined with wide receiver Marty Hensley for two touchdowns and Jerry Burch added two field goals Saturday as No. 2-ranked William Jewell defeated defending national champion Pacific Lutheran 19-14 in the opening round of the NAIA division II playoffs.

William Jewell now advances to NAIA semifinal action against Austin College Dec. 5 in Sherman, Texas. Austin whipped Panhandle State 27-16 Saturday to advance to the semifinals.

Pacific Lutheran, out of Tacoma, Wash., went into Saturday's contest ranked No. 1 in the nation. The loss dropped the Lutes to 9-1 for the season. William Jewell, ranked No. 2 in the nation, upped its record to 11-0.

The Cardinals jumped to a 13-0 halftime lead on two Burch field goals of 22 and 28 yards, and a 1-yard touchdown pass from Groom to Hensley after a scoreless first quarter.

Pacific Lutheran didn't make Jewell's interceptions the scoreboard until the third quarter, when Eric Munson also had two interceptions for Jewell while Mike snagged a 4-yard pass from Newnman added the other. quarterback Kevin Skogan to narrow the margin to 13-7.

The Cardinals held the key to the game with a outstanding defense that held Pacific, the No. 5 ranked offensive team in the NAIA, to 191 total yards. Pacific came into the game averaging 412 yards a game.

The William Jewell defense also intercepted five Pacific passes, two leading to touchdowns and a third coming in the Pacific end zone to eliminate a possible scoring drive.

Groom, a 6-0, 175-pound junior from LaGrange, Mo., was named the game's outstanding offensive player, completing 12 of 21 passes for 150 yards and two touchdowns.

Sophomore Paul Taylor, a 6-1, 175-pound defensive back, was named the outstanding defensive player, picking up two of William
