William Jewell maintained its top ranking in the weekly National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Division II football poll. Jewell received 13 of the 16 first-place votes. Two other schools improved their standing in the poll: Baker moved up to seventh from ninth, and Bethany from 17th to 14. Benedictine slipped from 13th to 20th after losing to Washburn. In the NAIA Division I poll, Missouri Southern remained fifth, while Fort Hays State moved up from 15th to 10th. Pittsburg State, which lost to Missouri-Rolla, dropped from eighth to 13th. . . .

Central Methodist easy for Jewell

Unbeaten William Jewell dominated play from the start in downing Central Methodist 34-3 Saturday night in Liberty. The victory undoubtedly assured the Cardinals, 4-0, of retaining their No. 1 spot in the NAIA Division II rankings.

The Cards ran up a 28-0 lead in the first half, then settled for a pair of field goals by Paul Dudley (33 and 31 yards) the last two

quarters. Jewell's defense didn't allow Central Methodist a first down until late in the third quarter. Central Methodist, 0-3, gained only 87 yards rushing and 16 passing.

Scoop Gillespie, who paced Jewell with 94 yards rushing, opened the scoring with a 16-yard run in the opening 3 minutes of the game. Steve Hodges capped a 68-yard drive by the Cardinals with a 5-yard scoring run late in the first quarter.

Jewell scored in the second

quarter on a halfback option pass, Charles Parrish connecting with Reggie Hill for 26 yards. Quarterback Scott Sandridge ended a 65-yard drive with a 4-yard scoring run 1:44 before the half.

Sparked by Tom Whiston's 19-yard run and Larry Clark's 18-yard run, Central Methodist drove from its 20 to the Jewell 22 and scored on Greg Hession's 40-yard field goal.

Jewell finished with 297 yards rushing and 95 passing.
