

Jewell rallies past Graceland

Lamoni, Iowa—The William Jewell Cardinals, ranked first in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Division II poll, scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns and rallied for a 20-13 victory Saturday over Graceland in a Heart of America Conference football game.

The Cardinals' fourth-quarter touchdowns came on a 10-yard run by Steve Hodges and a 7-yard

run by quarterback Scott Sandridge.

Jewell, 5-0 overall and 3-0 in the conference, took a 6-0 lead in the first quarter when cornerback Brian Fairchild returned an interception 49 yards. Mark Stanke's 49-yard run in the second quarter gave Graceland a 7-6 lead.

Graceland, 2-3 and 1-3, increased its lead to 13-6 in the third quarter on Keith Harder's field goals of 29 and 34 yards.

William Jewell's 20-13 victory at Graceland last week was

marked by a flurry of 15-yard penalties in the final 2 minutes. Jewell assistant **Rodger Labeth** said the penalty binge began after Jewell had scored a touchdown, breaking a 13-13 tie. Graceland received the kickoff and started a drive from its 30. On the first play Jewell linebacker Tim Johnson drew a 15-yard penalty for a late hit after a 10-yard gain by Graceland, moving the ball to the Jewell 45.

Graceland Coach Bill Dudek became enraged about the late hit and began flailing his arms at Johnson, accidentally touching an official. Graceland was penalized 15 yards. A Graceland assistant joined in the oral abuse and drew another 15-yard penalty. Dudek protested further and was whistled for another unsportsmanlike conduct, pushing the ball back to the Graceland 10.
